Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 4th August 2024



Gospel Reflection

Several scholars have suggested that Chapter 6 of John's Gospel may have originally been the text of a homily by an early Christian teacher on the Eucharistic action Jesus.

Jesus is apparently speaking to two groups here: those who witnessed the miracle of the loaves (last Sunday's Gospel) and those who did not see the miracle but have heard about it and want to see a similar sign for themselves. To the former, Jesus tells them that there is something much deeper in this event than "perishable food" being multiplied; the real "food" is the word of God proclaimed, its power and authority manifested in the miracles of the loaves.

To the latter group who seeks a sign as the Israelites sought a sign from Moses. Jesus reminds them that it was not Moses himself but God working through Moses that provided their "grumbling" Exodus ancestors with bread in the desert (recalled in today's first reading from Exodus). God has given his people new bread for the new covenant - the Risen Christ. connectionmediaworks



[1] NOTE: Both bread and wine are used to represent the offerings of ourselves - our prayers, works, joys and sufferings. The author uses poetic license to help draw closer connection between bread and 'work', and wine and 'joys'. Also, Youth Group specifically asked re: gluten-free bread.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Can't we taste something different?!

"Would Mass be valid if the priest used corn bread and rice wine?"





For the record, the answer is no. Why? Well, simply, because Jesus used wheat bread and grape wine, and asked us to "do this in memory of me." But that doesn't mean there's no other reason. Indeed, bread in the Old Testament was a sign of God's faithfulness to His people, as He sent down 'bread from heaven' to the Israelites in the desert. So too, wine was a key part of the Jewish Passover meal, especially the cup of blessing, which was a reminder of the Jewish messianic hopes for the rebuilding of Jerusalem.

Still, I can't help but wonder: what about for us now? Is there any significance of bread and wine that relates to us Catholics today? Let's take a look...

Bread – Bread, perhaps more than any other food, calls to mind *work* – "the hard work of ploughing and sowing, the moist brow of the reaper, the weariness of the arms which have threshed the wheat, and the grunts of the baker who kneaded the dough close to the scorching oven." Bread represents *our work*; be it at home, in the office, in the factory, or in the fields. So the bread offered by the priest at the altar – can be for us, the offering to God of *our daily work and struggles*.[1]

Wine – So too, *wine* is the offering our *daily work*, since wine too requires work farming, harvesting, crushing, fermenting, filtering, etc. Moreover, wine is a festive drink, enjoyed on joyous occasions. And so the wine offered by the priest at the altar – can be for us, the offering of *our daily joys and triumphs*.

Water – Lastly, the water. Water mixed with wine was an ancient custom, which is why Jesus' chalice contained them both at the Last Supper. Accordingly, water is mixed with wine in the Mass, in part to demonstrate a significant point: our entry to Heaven is brought about – not so much by our own human efforts (water) – but through the Sacrifice of Christ's blood (wine). Notice too, the priest only pours a few drops of water into the chalice, compared to a good pouring of wine. Thus, the water is absorbed into the wine, just as Jesus absorbs us into Himself – it is our union with Christ that opens our Way to Heaven.

So then, what shall we do this Mass? Well, here's three...

- 1) When the priest first takes the bread at the altar and raises it up for the offering: **gaze at the bread** for this is *your works and struggles* of this week, offered to God;
- 2) So too, when the priest takes the chalice at the altar and raises it up for the offering: **gaze at the wine** for this is *your joys and triumphs* of this week, offered to God; and
- 3) When you see the priest pour the water and wine into the chalice, **remember**, it is not *your offerings by themselves*, but your offerings *united with Christ's offering* (of Himself to The Father) that opens for you the gates of Heaven.

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year B

First Reading

Exodus 16:2-4, 12-15 (JB)

A reading from the book of Exodus

I will rain bread from heaven upon you.

The whole community of the sons of Israel began to complain against Moses and Aaron in the wilderness and said to them, 'Why did we not die at the Lord's hand in the land of Egypt, when we were able to sit down to pans of meat and could eat bread to our heart's content! As it is, you have brought us to this wilderness to starve this whole company to death!'

Then the Lord said to Moses, 'Now I will rain down bread for you from the heavens. Each day the people are to go out and gather the day's portion; I propose to test them in this way to see whether they will follow my law or not.'

'I have heard the complaints of the sons of Israel. Say this to them, "Between the two evenings you shall eat meat, and in the morning you shall have bread to your heart's content. Then you will learn that I, the Lord, am your God." And so it came about: quails flew up in the evening, and they covered the camp; in the morning there was a coating of dew all round the camp. When the coating of dew lifted, there on the surface of the desert was a thing delicate, powdery, as fine as hoarfrost on the ground. When they saw this, the sons of Israel said to one another, 'What is that?' not knowing what it was. 'That' said Moses to them 'is the bread the Lord gives you to eat.'

Now that is hardly the way you have learnt from Christ, unless you failed to hear him properly when you were taught what the truth is in Jesus. You must give up your old way of life; you must put aside your old self, which gets corrupted by following illusory

desires. Your mind must be renewed by a spiritual revolution so that you can put on the new self that has been created in God's way, in the goodness and holiness of the truth.

When the people saw that neither Jesus nor his disciples were there, they got into boats and crossed to Capernaum to look for Jesus. When they found him on the other side, they said to him, 'Rabbi, when did you come here?' Jesus answered:

'I tell you most solemnly, you are not looking for me because you have seen the signs but because you had all the bread you wanted to eat. Do not work for food that cannot last, but work for food that endures to eternal life, the kind of food the Son of Man is offering you, for on him the Father, God himself, has set his seal.'

Then they said to him, 'What must we do if we are to do the works that God wants?' Jesus gave them this answer, 'This is working for God: you must believe in the one he has sent.' So they said, 'What sign will you give to show us that we should believe in you? What work will you do? Our fathers had manna to eat in the desert; as scripture says: He gave them bread from heaven to eat.'

Jesus answered: 'I tell you solemnly, it was not Moses who gave you bread from heaven, it is my Father who gives you the bread from heaven, the true bread; for the bread of God is that which comes down from heaven and gives life to the world.'

'Sir,' they said 'give us that bread always.' Jesus answered: 'I am the bread of life. He who comes to me will never be hungry; he who believes in me will never thirst.'
