What is the Pastoral Discernment Process For?

The project aims to understand the challenges and opportunities of our deanery so that we can participate more fully in mission.

Our conversations will inform the development of Bishop Anthony's pastoral mission implementation plan, and they will inform the work of our own parish pastoral council.

Questions for Discernment

- 1. How can we connect with people who don't identify with a religion and involve them in mission?
- 2. What ministries are needed to meet the spiritual and pastoral needs of families?
- 3. What avenues for mission can we provide for young people on the Northern Beaches?
- 4. How can we improve our outreach to people experiencing disadvantage, and issues like domestic and family violence, mental health and wellbeing challenges, or the effects of the housing affordability crisis?
- 5. How can we enhance and strengthen Catholic communities on the Northen Beaches?


FEAST OF ST ANTHONY OF PADUA THIS WEEKEND

parables of the sower and the



mustard seed, then, are calls to patience, hope and readiness.

The mustard seed – that tiny speck containing the chemical energy to create the great tree – is a natural parable for the greatness that God raises up from small beginnings.

Jesus may have been directing his words to the Zealots, a Jewish sect that sought the political restoration of Israel. Many Zealots were terrorists, employing murder and insurrection to destabilize the Roman government. The Zealots dreamed of a Messiah who would restore the Jewish nation. Jesus, however, calls them to see their identity as God's people not in terms of political might but of interior faith and spiritual openness to the love of God.

Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time- Year B

First Reading

Ezekiel 17:22-24 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel

I have made the small tree great.

The Lord says this: 'From the top of the cedar, from the highest branch I will take a shoot and plant it myself on a very high mountain. I will plant it on the high mountain of Israel. It will sprout branches and bear fruit, and become a noble cedar. Every kind of bird will live beneath it, every winged creature rest in the shade of its branches. And every tree of the field will learn that I, the Lord, am the one who stunts tall trees and makes the low ones grow, who withers green trees and makes the withered green. I, the Lord, have spoken, and I will do it.'

The word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.

Responsorial Psalm *Ps* 91:2-3, 13-16 (JB) **R. Lord it is good to give thanks to you.**

It is good to give thanks to the Lord to make music to your name, O Most High, to proclaim your love in the morning and your truth in the watches of the night. R.

The just will flourish like the palm-tree and grow like a Lebanon cedar. R.

Planted in the house of the Lord they will flourish in the courts of our God, still bearing fruit when they are old, still full of sap, still green, to proclaim that the Lord is just. In him, my rock, there is no wrong. R.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:6-10 (JB)

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing the Lord.

We are always full of confidence when we remember that to live in the body means to be exiled from the Lord, going as we do by faith and not by sight - we are full of confidence, I say, and actually want to be exiled from the body and make our home with the Lord. Whether we are living in the body or exiled from it, we are intent on pleasing him. For all the truth about us will be brought out in the law court of Christ, and each of us will get what he deserves for the things he did in the body, good or bad.

The word of the Lord. All: Thanks be to God.

Gospel

Mark 4:26-34 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The mustard seed, the smallest of all the seeds, grows into the biggest shrub of all.

Jesus said to the crowd, 'This is what the kingdom of God is like. A man throws seed on the land. Night and day, while he sleeps, when he is awake, the seed is sprouting and growing; how, he does not know. Of its own accord the land produces first the shoot, then the ear, then the full grain in the ear. And when the crop is ready, he loses no time; he starts to reap because the harvest has come.'

He also said, 'What can we say the kingdom of God is like? What parable can we find for it? It is like a mustard seed which at the time of its sowing in the soil is the smallest of all the seeds on earth; yet once it is sown it grows into the biggest shrub of them all and puts out big branches so that the birds of the air can shelter in its shade.'

Using many parables like these, he spoke the word to them, so far as they were capable of understanding it. He would not speak to them except in parables, but he explained everything to his disciples when they were alone.
