

Gospel Reflection

In today's Gospel, the Twelve – each of whom has been called personally by Jesus – are given the title of **apostle** – "one who is sent." These unlikely candidates for such a task are carefully prepared and taught by Jesus for this moment. They undertake their first preaching and healing tour depending only on God for their inspiration and on the charity of others for their needs – remember that hospitality was considered a sacred responsibility in the east: it was not up to the stranger to seek hospitality but up to the prospective host to offer it.

[1] THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS: Note: only sacramental Confession can absolve us of both venial and mortal sins. The Penitential Act absolves us of venial sins.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Break the rock, uncover the treasure.

Cathartic (kə-thär-tik).

An adjective meaning "a release from tension within us, allowing spiritual renewal." It's not a word we use every day. But it's a good one.



Because for me it perfectly describes that moment in the Mass when, during the Penitential Act, we strike our breast 3 times and proclaim aloud: "through my fault, through my most grievous fault."

I suspect many Catholic *secretly* love that moment. Even if it does seem... rather expressive. Because striking your breast is an old biblical gesture; a gesture of deep repentance; a gesture that seeks to bring consolation to the sinner in his racking sorrow. It's... *cathartic*.

Still, you might ask: why do we need to confess our faults though? Isn't it all a bit too much... guilt and shame?

Hmmm, I get that. Well, let's have a look.

Firstly, the Penitential Act ("I confess to Almighty God...") is a prayer firmly rooted in the Christian faith. One of the earliest Christian writings from the first century, the *Didache*, records the early liturgy: "On the Lord's Day, we meet together; break bread and give thanks, after having first confessed our sins, so that our sacrifice may be pure." The Penitential Act (in some form) was practiced by the earliest Christians, and purifies us from *venial* sins so that we may best partake in the Holy Eucharist.[1]

Secondly — and this is critical — to confess our sins brings healing. I am deeply saddened by how much guilt people carry nowadays. People are worn down with guilt; weary from the heavy load — and so often, they don't even know it. Because no one has ever taught them how to pray; to hand over their struggles; to admit their faults to Jesus — and because of this, so many people instead repress their sins, burying them deep down, trying to ignore they exist. But alas, it doesn't help. The struggles don't go away, but like rock that accumulates over time, it grows around their heart, covering it over, and making their heart heavier and heavier. Oh, how great the burden of this afflicted soul!

...What can be done? How can our hearts be freed from this burden?

Well, dear friends. Break the rock.

Today let us break that rock which has grown around our hearts. All those faults and sins we dare not turn our eyes towards, instead, let us face them. Face that sin today that you really struggle with — you know the *one* — that sin which burdens you so very much. Call it to mind during the Penitential Act. Sincerely confess before "Almighty God, and you my brothers and sisters" — that "I have greatly sinned."

And then, in that moment when you strike your breast 3 times – strike and break the rock. Break the rock around your heart, so that Jesus Christ might enter there, and piece by piece, remove the rocks that keep your soul from soaring up to Him.

Today, during the Penitential Act: confess your sin, break the rock, and let Our Lord do the rest.





Why the 'Year of Prayer?'

On January 21, 2024, Pope Francis officially began the Year of Prayer.

"Before the wedding, we couldn't talk enough. Sometimes we would even talk late at night. He wanted to know what I was thinking, what I was going through, what made me happy. Today, the only thing he'll ask is if dinner is ready and his shirts are ironed. Sometimes we sit in silence and I don't know what to talk to him about." This is a confession that so many people can relate to, too many.

Endless conversations and too long silence.

No one has any doubts that what was missing was not topics to talk about, but love.

It may not always be the case that when we talk less it means we love less, but we always lose the desire to talk when we lose love.

Interestingly, it was through conversation that this love initially ignited and grew.

Isn't it similar with our relationship with God?
If you want to know how much you love God, look at your prayer.

Prayer is nothing else than a conversation with God. Is your conversation with God a conversation between two lovers or rather a monologue dictated by duty or tradition? How often do you talk to Him? Is it only in the evening, if you are not too sleepy?

Let me ask you, if you talked to your wife or husband for the same amount of time – would you still call it a relationship of love?

If you didn't speak to your wife, your husband all day, until the evening, and only a moment before going to bed, and even then with a bored voice, you would recite a formula you've known since childhood. Would you call that a loving relationship?

But what to talk to God about, what to tell Him? **Everything**. Yes, tell Him what you are thinking, what you are planning, what your desires are and what your fears are. Tell Him what makes you happy and what makes you sad. Tell Him what you heard at work, in the store, what surprised you and what delighted you.

But wait, if He is God, then He already knows all this. So why tell Him this?

It is true – God knows your past, present and even your future. He knows all this, but even then He wants to hear it from you, because it makes Him happy.

Recently a good rep of your Youth and Young Adults jumped in a bus together, and headed on over to the Ignite Rally. Over 200 came to the night, with highenergy praise and worship, inspirational testimonies, reflective prayer, and plenty of time for just chilling out at the BBQ. A great time was had by all – and we're looking forward to sending an even bigger cohort to the official Ignite Conference in September.




Jesus sent the disciples out two by two. If this happened to you, who would you take as your partner? Write their name and why you would take them with you and draw their picture.

Now you too, in him, have heard the message of the truth and the good news of your salvation, and have believed it: and you have been stamped with the seal of the Holy Spirit of the Promise, the pledge of our inheritance which brings freedom for those whom God has taken for his own, to make his glory praised.
