
# Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time – 7<sup>th</sup> July 2024



## **Gospel Reflection**

They are too obsessed with superficialities – occupation, ancestry, origins – to realize God present in their midst and to be affected by that presence.

# THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

### Table manners in the Neolithic Age

"What are you doing?!"

"What?" I stammer defensively, quickly putting down the knife.



"No no," he exclaims, seizing the knife. "You don't cut the bread. You break it!"

A little while ago, I was at a wedding reception, and my friend admonished me for using a knife to cut open a bread roll – you know – one of those little ones with butter you get at a restaurant before the entrée. At the time, I waved him away dismissively: "Ah, what's the fuss with all this table etiquette. Does it really matter?"

...But the more I think about it, the more I realise, he's right.

Breaking bread is one of the oldest traditions in human history, tracing back thousands of years – the Neolithic Age. The father of the family, presiding at table, would break bread and distribute it amongst his family to start the meal. And yet, despite its antiquity, breaking bread is by no means foreign to us Catholics. Every week in the Mass, the priest 'breaks the bread' – the sacred Host – right before Communion. Why though?

### + + +

Let's cut to the chase; firstly, it's practical. In the early Church only *one* loaf was used for the Eucharistic Sacrifice. And so, before it could be distributed, the deacon had to break it up so that all Christians might partake. To break the bread allows *all* to share in Christ.

The second reason is this: because Jesus did so, and told us to. At the Last Supper, Jesus blessed, broke and gave the bread to His disciples, saying: "This is my body... Do this in memory of me." (Mark 14:22, Matt 26:26, Luke 22:19). Critically, in breaking the bread, Jesus *prophesied* that His body would be broken and His blood poured out. He *foretold* what was to happen to Him, and so *pre-presented* His crucifixion on Calvary, so that all present at table could become sharers in his Sacrifice. His disciples became *participants* in His Passion and Death.

#### + + +

Here lies the crucial point for us. Every Mass, we too become *participants* in Christ's Passion and Death. The Mass is not "a new sacrifice" each time, but rather a "representation of Christ's Sacrifice on Calvary."

And we are participants in this Sacrifice! Please please don't miss this point.

Because, if we are participants in Christ's *Passion* and *Death*, then so too – are we participants in His *Resurrection*.

Simply put, by partaking in the Holy Mass – we will be *raised* up to eternal life on the Last Day. (John 6:35). That's the promise! Eternal life with God. Forever in Heaven. Ah, don't you see! How I wish all knew this truth!

So, dear friends, what shall we do?

Well, let's start today. This Mass, when the priest 'breaks the bread' before Holy Communion, take this moment – don't miss it – to gaze upon Christ's Body. Gaze upon the Body which *breaks* for us. Gaze upon the Body which *breaks* apart the fetters of sin and death. Gaze upon the Body which *breaks* open the gates of Heaven – for you.



Our Young Adults group takes part in watching together round 2 of the State of Origin in St Joseph House.




We hosted a Movie Night for the Young Adults and a separate movie for our Youth Group.



And Jesus said to them, 'A prophet is only despised in his own country among his own relations and in his own house'; and he could work no miracle there, though he cured a few sick people by laying his hands on them.
