

Pentecost Sunday - 19th May 2024



Gospel Reflection

Pentecost was the Jewish festival of the harvest (also called the Feast of Weeks), celebrated 50 days after Passover, when the first fruits of the corn harvest were offered to the Lord. A feast of pilgrimage (hence

the presence in Jerusalem of so many "devout Jews of every nation"), Pentecost also commemorated Moses' receiving the Law on Mount Sinai. For the new Israel, Pentecost becomes the celebration of the Spirit of God's compassion, peace and forgiveness – the Spirit that transcends the Law and becomes the point of departure for the young Church's universal mission (the planting of a new harvest?).

In his Acts of the Apostles (Reading 1), Luke invokes the First Testament images of wind and fire in his account of the new Church's Pentecost: God frequently revealed his presence in fire (the pillar of fire in the Sinai) and in wind (the wind that sweeps over the earth to make the waters of the Great Flood subside). The Hebrew word for spirit, **ruah**, and the Greek word **pneuma** also refer to the movement of air, not only as wind, but also of life-giving breath (as in God's creation of man in Genesis 2 and the revivification of the dry bones in Ezekiel 37). Through his life-giving "breath," the Lord begins the era of the new Israel on Pentecost.

Today's Gospel of the first appearance of the Risen Jesus before ten of his disciples (remember Thomas is not present) on Easter night is John's version of the Pentecost event. In "breathing" the Holy Spirit upon them, Jesus imitates God's act of creation in Genesis. Just as Adam's life came from God, so the disciples' new life of the Spirit comes from Jesus. In the Resurrection, the Spirit replaces their sense of self-centered fear and confusion with the "peace" of understanding, enthusiasm and joy and shatters all barriers among them to make of them a community of hope and forgiveness. By Christ's sending them forth, the disciples become apostles – "those sent."

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS.

What does the first bell mean?

As a young boy altar serving, one of the most panic-inducing jobs in the Mass was the bells. Knowing when to ring them (and when not to) was an art form that I never quite mastered, and instead, to the delight of my fellow servers, I'd bungle it each week.



Still, after four years in the seminary, I think I've got it. When we're all kneeling down, and the priest extends his hands over the chalice - that is when the first bell rings.

But why, you ask? Why do we kneel down for this moment? And what does that first bell mean?

To answer this, let's travel back three thousand years.

During the times of the Old Testament, on a very special occasion only once a year, the Jewish high priest would ceremonially enter the Holy of Holies (the innermost sanctuary of the Temple) to present to God the offering of the blood of the victims. Because the Holy of Holies was the most sacred of all places, the place where God dwelt, only the Jewish high priest could enter here. Carrying the offerings, he presented them to God on behalf of himself and the people, in atonement for their sins, and he did so in an atmosphere of silence, awe and respect.

Friends, in the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, the same thing takes place, albeit perfectly, with the one true Victim, Jesus Christ.

At every Mass, the priest (acting in the person of Christ), takes the offerings of bread and wine, and ceremonially presents them to God on behalf of himself and the people. Indeed, at that sacred moment when we all kneel down for the first time, the priest, extending his hands over the bread and wine, asks the Holy Spirit to come down upon the gifts. At this moment, we hear the bells ring just once, and in an atmosphere of silence, awe and respect, the Holy Spirit comes down, and the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Jesus Christ.

Do not misunderstand me. Please do not think I speak symbolically. Such is my great fear.

Through the mystical workings of the Holy Spirit, and while retaining the appearance of bread and wine, the offerings *truly* and *substantially* become the Body and Blood of our Lord Jesus Christ. This is the great miracle of the Holy Spirit.

And so today, dear friends, when you kneel down for the first time in the Mass, and you see Father extend his hands over the chalice, and you hear that first bell ring - know that that is the moment the great miracle takes place.

It is at this moment we are in the midst of the Holy of Holies.

May God bless you.

FR CHIMA'S INSTALLATION MASS

Mary Immaculate Church Manly – Sunday 9th June

I've noticed that many of our parishioners might not be familiar with the significance and objectives of the installation of a parish priest. With my forthcoming installation, I see a wonderful chance to explain to you all



what this ceremony involves and why it's important.

The installation of a parish priest is a significant event both for the priest himself and for the parish community. This ceremony is much more than a formal introduction; it represents several key aspects of Church life and the role of a priest within the community.

Spiritual Leadership: The installation ceremony marks the beginning of the priest's leadership in the parish. It highlights his role as a spiritual guide and shepherd to his new flock, emphasizing his responsibilities in leading them in faith and service.



Pentecost Sunday - Year B

First Reading

Acts 2:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak different languages.

When Pentecost day came round, the apostles had all met in one room, when suddenly they heard what sounded like a powerful wind from heaven, the noise of which filled the entire house in which they were sitting; and something appeared to them that seemed like tongues of fire; these separated and came to rest on the head of each of them. They were all filled with the Holy Spirit, and began to speak foreign languages as the Spirit gave them the gift of speech.

Now there were devout men living in Jerusalem from every nation under heaven, and at this sound they all assembled, each one bewildered to hear these men speaking his own language. They were amazed and astonished. 'Surely' they said 'all these men speaking are Galileans? How does it happen that each of us hears them in his own native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; people from Mesopotamia, Judaea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia, Phrygia and Pamphylia, Egypt and the parts of Libya round Cyrene; as well as visitors from Rome - Jews and proselytes alike - Cretans and Arabs; we hear them preaching in our own language about the marvels of God.'

Second Reading Gala

Galatians 5:16-25

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Galatians *The fruit of the Spirit.*

If you are guided by the Spirit you will be in no danger of yielding to self-indulgence, since selfindulgence is the opposite of the Spirit, the Spirit is totally against such a thing, and it is precisely because the two are so opposed that you do not always carry out your good intentions. If you are led by the Spirit, no law can touch you. When selfindulgence is at work the results are obvious: fornication, indecency gross and sexual irresponsibility; idolatry and sorcery; feuds and wrangling, jealousy, bad temper and quarrels; disagreements, factions, envy; drunkenness, orgies and similar things. I warn you now, as I warned you before: those who behave like this will not inherit the kingdom of God. What the Spirit brings is very different: love, joy, peace, patience, kindness, goodness, trustfulness, gentleness and self-control. There can be no law against things like that, of course. You cannot belong to Christ Jesus unless you crucify all self-indulgent passions and desire.

Since the Spirit is our life, let us be directed by the Spirit.

And you too will be witnesses, because you have been with me from the outset. 'I still have many things to say to you but they would be too much for you now. But when the Spirit of truth comes he will lead you to the complete truth, since he will not be speaking as from himself but will say only what he has learnt; and he will tell you of the things to come. He will glorify me, since all he tells you will be taken from what is mine. Everything the Father has is mine; that is why I said: All he tells you will be taken from what is mine.'


