

Gospel Reflection

Today the lectionary interrupts the semi-continuous readings from Mark's Gospel for a five-week reading of Chapter 6 from the Gospel of John: Jesus' the "bread of life" discourse.

The miracle of the feeding of the multitude with a few loaves and fish is the only miracle recorded in all four

Gospels. This story was cherished by the first Christians for whom the Eucharist was becoming the center of their life together. Jesus' actions are indeed "Eucharistic": bread (and fish) is given, Jesus gives thanks (the word used in the Greek text of Mark's Gospel is **eucharisteo**), breaks the bread and the community feasts. **connectionsmediaworks**

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Receiving Communion in medieval England.

We all have some strange and obscure fascination.

Mine's the parish life of late medieval England. I love reading about the piety, traditions and customs of sixteenth century Catholics, especially for the Mass.

Indeed, when it came to receiving Holy Communion, parishioners were *very* devout. To receive, Catholics would go to confession, settle disputes with neighbours, fast from food and drink for several days, and then put on their best clothes for Mass. Because they only



received once a year (on Easter Sunday) many parishioners got nervous about getting it right, and so would practise the ritual at home – how to approach the altar, how to receive the Sacred Host, and how to consume the Precious Blood without spilling. Such stories always make me smile. There's something endearing about them. Even beautiful.

But they also remind me: how can I better prepare myself for the Holy Sacrament? This week, dear friends, allow me to suggest four things I've found helpful to prepare: Avow, Adore, Approach, Amen.

AVOW: The first is to avow; to devoutly recite that beautiful prayer right before Communion: "Lord, I'm not worthy..." It's a great preparation, because when we pray it, not only are we quoting the Roman centurion who asks Jesus for healing in Matthew 8, but also, in a world intent on getting to the top and being found worthy, instead we Catholics avow: "Lord, I'm *not* worthy to receive You in the Eucharist under my roof (under the roof *of my mouth*), but only say the word, and my soul shall be healed." It's a great prayer to recite over and over, as we process up the Communion line.

ADORE: Second, adore. St Augustine says: "let no one receive the Eucharist without having first adored it." As we process up the line, and shortly before we receive, we are invited as Australian Catholics to make a small bow to adore Our Lord in the Eucharist; to reverence the Sacred Mystery we are about to receive.

APPROACH: The third is our approach. As we all know, there are several ways to receive Jesus Christ in the Holy Eucharist – standing or kneeling, on the tongue or by making a throne of our hands. In our diocese, our Bishop has encouraged *all* these ways as good and reverent. The most important thing – is that we seek to show the *greatest* love and devotion to Our Lord as possible.

AMEN: Lastly, Amen. The word 'Amen' means 'So be it!' and was traditionally a Jewish word used to agree on a contract — a way of expressing assent. At Holy Communion, upon hearing the words: "The Body of Christ", we respond "Amen", and so thereby declare: "Yes Jesus, I firmly believe in You, and desire to receive You into my body and soul."

And that's it. That's four simple ways we can prepare ourselves for Holy Communion. I won't ask you to do any of these in particular – my respect for that sacred moment between you and Our Lord is too great.

Still, if there was just *one* thing you might do, what would it be? What might you do *this* Mass, to show your great love for Our Lord at Holy Communion?



A reading from the holy Gospel according to John


He distributed to those who were seated as much as they wanted.

Jesus went off to the other side of the Sea of Galilee - or of Tiberias - and a large crowd followed him, impressed by the signs he gave by curing the sick. Jesus climbed the hillside, and sat down there with his disciples. It was shortly before the Jewish feast of Passover.

Looking up, Jesus saw the crowds approaching and said to Philip, 'Where can we buy some bread for these people to eat?' He only said this to test Philip; he himself knew exactly what he was going to do. Philip answered, 'Two hundred denarii would only buy enough to give them a small piece each.' One of his disciples, Andrew, Simon Peter's brother, said, 'There is a small boy here with five barley loaves and two fish; but what is that between so many?' Jesus said to them, 'Make the people sit down.' There was plenty of grass there, and as many as five thousand men sat down. Then Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks and gave them out to all who were sitting ready; he then did the same with the fish, giving out as much as was wanted. When they had eaten enough he said to the disciples, 'Pick up the pieces left over, so that nothing gets wasted.' So they picked them up, and filled twelve hampers with scraps left over from the meal of five barley loaves. The people, seeing this sign that he had given, said, 'This really is the prophet who is to come into the world.' Jesus, who could see they were about to come and take him by force and make him king, escaped back to the hills by himself.
