Gospel Reflection

The apostles return from their first mission of preaching and healing and report to Jesus. He gathers them in a "deserted" place, but the people find them and keep coming. Even their attempt to escape by boat to the other side of the lake is foiled once word gets out.

This incident recorded by Mark in today's Gospel (which precedes his account of the feeding of the multitude) offers two important insights into our Church's ministry: that the mission of the Church does not spring from mass marketing techniques or publicity strategies but from the Gospel of compassion we seek to live and share, from the authority of our commitment to forgiveness and reconciliation; and leadership, inspired by the wisdom of God, means not dictating and ruling over others but inspiring, providing for and selflessly caring for those whom we are called to lead.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

Till the soil, receive the seed

I've never had a green thumb.

I've never been good at gardening. When I was a young boy, I tried growing an avocado tree – and after months of preparing the seed, suspending it in water, planting it in the sun, the tree stunted and refused to grow. Alas.



My grandfather, meanwhile... ...Now HE was a gardener. A *real* gardener. Every day in the garden, cutting, weeding, tilling, pruning, making life flourish. His garden was always full of colour – trees, water, fruits, flowers. I loved it. It's probably why, these days, when I come across some complex idea in philosophy or theology, I'll think up some *garden analogy* to help me understand. So this week, let's try out a garden analogy for the Mass. The topic? The Homily. Specifically, how can we get the most out of it?

+ + +

Okay, just in case, for those who don't know – the Homily is the preaching the priest does immediately after the readings. 'Homily' means 'explanation' in Greek. The way I see it – the Homily has three elements: seed, sunshine and water.

Seed – The seed is the Word of God. It's the Scripture Readings we hear at Mass. The priest uses the Readings as the foundation of his homily. And just as a seed has life, so too the readings bring us life – eternal life in Heaven.[1]

Sunshine – Secondly, the sunshine is the priest's explanation. That's why he sheds *light* on Scripture. By teaching and explaining the Word, the Homily draws out even deeper meaning for us Christians to apply to our lives, just as sunshine stimulates growth in the seed.

Water – Lastly, the water is the Holy Spirit. If you've been baptised, then the Holy Spirit dwells *in* you. This means you have the gift of *understanding* the Word so that it can powerfully change your life, just as water helps a seed to change and grow into life. So that's it.

...And yet, something critical is missing...

+ + -

Soil – The soil. Ah, dear friends, we must not forget – the soil. The soil is you. You are the soil! But just like you, soil was never made to just sit in the garden; lifeless, unanimated. No, it was made to be transformed into *life*. And so the seed of life (the Word of God) *must* enter us, enter the soil, and draw us from being lifeless soil to an active growing plant.

But you might ask, well, what can I do to receive the seed?

Well dear friends... *till the soil*. To receive the seed, let us till the soil today, dig it up and toss it about, so a space is prepared for the seed to enter. To *till the soil* is to prepare ourselves for the Word; to bring some question to God for which we seek answers.

What question do you want to ask God today?

What's the big question in your life right *now*? Take a moment. What is *that* question? About family? Or job? Health? Vocation? Relationship?

Take a moment, and then bring *that* question today to the Homily. Then, truly *listen* to the Homily. God gives answers, if but only we listen.

Till the soil, so the seed can enter.


An excellent series!





First Reading

Jeremiah 23:1-6 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah

The remnant of the flock I will gather to me, and bring them back to their pastures.

'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered - it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds - it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers.
