The Ascension of the Lord – 12th May 2024



Gospel Reflection

Today's readings include two accounts of Jesus' return to the Father:

Reading 1 is the beginning of the Acts of the Apostles, Luke's "Gospel of the Holy Spirit." Jesus' Ascension begins volume 2 of Luke's work. The words and images evoke the First

Testament accounts of the ascension of Elijah (2 Kings 2) and the forty years of the Exodus: Luke considers the time that the Risen Lord spent with his disciples a sacred time, a "desert experience" for the apostles to prepare them for their new ministry of preaching the Gospel of the resurrection. (Acts alone places the Ascension forty days after Easter; the synoptic Gospels – including, strangely, Luke's – specifically place Jesus' Ascension on the day of Easter; John writes of the "ascension" not as an event but as a new existence with the Father.)

Responding to their question about the restoration of Israel, Jesus discourages his disciples from guessing what cannot be known. Greater things await them as his "witnesses." In the missionary work before them, Christ will be with them in the presence of the Spirit to come.

Scholars call today's Gospel the "longer ending" of Mark's text. In style and substance, these six verses are very unlike Mark; the best guess is that these verses were added sometime in the first century to "complete" Mark's account to include the tradition of the Ascension of Jesus. Before returning to the Father, Jesus commissions his new church to continue Christ's presence on earth through their proclamation of the "good news."

Pope Francis Prayer Intention for May – For The Formation Of Men And Women Religious And Seminarians

Let us pray that men and women religious and seminarians, grow in their own vocational journey through human, pastoral, spiritual and community formation, that leads them to be credible witnesses of the Gospel.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS.

Why do we stand to hear the Gospel?

Every Sunday Mass, as a community, we sit and listen to the readings taken from Holy Scripture; sometimes from the Old Testament, other times from the Acts of the



Apostles, other times a letter from St Paul, St John or St James. During all these readings, we remain quietly seated.

Compare that with the Gospel, however, and well, just look. The moment we hear the Gospel coming, all of us – on our feet, standing upright, candles alight, Gospel procession, crosses on heads lips and hearts, sometimes incense, and all singing the alleluias.

And yet, taking a step back, one might fairly ask: "Why all this ceremony? Why such acclamation? Why do we stand to hear the Gospel?"

Friends, let me first note that, ever since the Gospels were first read in Christian churches, the faithful have never listened to it in any other way than standing up. Indeed, during the Middle Ages, those leaning on staves would leave them on the ground, knights would draw their swords from their sheathes and remove their cloaks and gloves, and princes would take off their crowns to hear the Gospel proclaimed.

All these actions were special marks of respect for the sacred words recorded by Saints Matthew, Mark, Luke and John, given that the Gospels most closely follow the life and teachings of our Lord Jesus Christ. As *Dei Verbum* states, "among all the Scriptures, even those of the New Testament, the Gospels have a special preeminence... for they are the principal witness for the life and teaching of the Incarnate Word, our Saviour."

In other words, nothing compares to the Gospels.

No great work of philosophy, or history, or poetry, or classic work of antiquity can ever compare to the Gospels, because these are the words of God Himself, inspired by the Holy Spirit and recorded by the sacred authors. These words have the power to draw us out of our worldly fixations, centre our attention on Jesus Christ, and configure us more closely to Him.

And so, friends, if I could make just one point, let it be this.

If it is indeed true (and it is) that the way to Heaven for each of us is by coming to know and imitate our Lord Jesus Christ... then wouldn't we do *anything* at Mass just to hear a passage, a single phrase, even a solitary word – recorded in the Gospels? Wouldn't we drop everything in our hands, quieten our lips, and still our bodies, just to hear the Word proclaimed? Wouldn't we give our fullest attention to the words that have the power to bring us life forever in Heaven?

Friends, this is why we stand for the Gospel. May God bless you. Seminarian Matthew.

The Ascension of the Lord – Year B

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11 (JB)

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Why are you standing here looking into the sky? Jesus has been taken into heaven.

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.'

R. God mounts his throne to shouts of joy: a blare of trumpets for the Lord.

All peoples, clap your hands, cry to God with shouts of joy! For the Lord, the Most High, we must fear, great king over all the earth. R.

God goes up with shouts of joy; the Lord goes up with trumpet blast. Sing praise for God, sing praise, sing praise to our king, sing praise. R.

God is king of all the earth. Sing praise with all your skill. God is king over the nations; God reigns on his holy throne. R.

Second Reading

Ephesians 1:17-23 (JB)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to the Ephesians

He made Jesus to sit at his right hand in heaven.

May the God of our Lord Jesus Christ, the Father of glory, give you a spirit of wisdom and perception of what is revealed, to bring you to full knowledge of him. May he enlighten the eyes of your mind so that you can see what hope his call holds for you, what rich glories he has promised the saints will inherit and how infinitely great is the power that he has exercised for us believers. This you can tell from the strength of his power at work in Christ, when he used it to raise him from the dead and to make him sit at his right hand, in heaven, far above every Sovereignty, Authority, Power, or Domination, or any other name that can be named, not only in this age, but also in the age to come. He has put all things under his feet, and made him as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.

Mark 16:15-20 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Lord Jesus was taken into heaven and is seated at the right hand of God.

Jesus showed himself to the Eleven, and said to them, 'Go out to the whole world, proclaim the Good News to all creation. He who believes and is baptised will be saved; he who does not believe will be condemned. These are the signs that will be associated with believers: in my name they will cast out devils; they will have the gift of tongues; they will pick up snakes in their hands, and be unharmed should they drink deadly poison; they will lay their hands on the sick, who will recover.'

And so the Lord Jesus, after he had spoken to them, was taken up into heaven: there at the right hand of God he took his place, while they, going out, preached everywhere, the Lord working with them and confirming the word by the signs that accompanied it.
