# The Baptism of the Lord – 12th January 2025



# **Gospel Reflection**

Today's Gospel is the final event of the Epiphany: Jesus' baptism at the Jordan River by John. The Christmas season "officially" (liturgically) comes to an end today at the banks of the Jordan. Jesus is no longer the child in a Bethlehem manger but the adult Redeemer making his way to Jerusalem. The good news spoken by the angels continues to unfold; the most wondrous part of the Christ story is yet to be revealed. Today, the same Spirit that "anoints" the Messiah for his mission us to be about the work of Christmas in this new year: to seek out and find the lost, to heal the hurting, to feed the hungry, to free the imprisoned, to rebuild nations, to bring peace to all peoples everywhere.

Luke presents Jesus as the last person to be baptized by John, bringing John's ministry to completion. Luke describes the scene with many images from the First Testament:

- the sky opens ("Oh, that you would rend the heavens and come down" – Isaiah 63: 19)
- the Spirit "descended upon him like a dove" (many rabbis likened the wind above the waters at the dawn of Genesis to a dove hovering above its newborn; in employing this image, Luke suggests that, in this Jesus, a new Genesis is about to take place)
- the "voice from heaven" identifies and confirms Jesus as God's "beloved son." Jesus' baptism at the Jordan becomes the moment of God's "anointing" of his Messiah (the word Messiah means "anointed") for the work he is about to do.

# SACRAMENT PROGRAM 2025

Communion) over a twelve month period, beginning in **Year 3** and concluding in **Year 4**.

- First Holy Communion will be celebrated on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> June – 11.30am at both Churches

If your child is in **Year 3** or above and is **Baptised Catholic**, he/she is eligible to enrol in the Sacramental program which begins with **Confirmation**



Our parish hasted one last year. It was incredible time for many, who attended. New life ideas, good food, great stories, new friends with same faith, that was renewed.


This year we are going for it again.

more about this remarkable saint, nurturing devotion to him, and seeking his powerful intercession.



ST. JOHN VIANNEY

St. John Vianney, also known as the *Curé of Ars*, is one of the most beloved saints of the Catholic Church and the patron saint of parish priests. He was born on May 8, 1786, in Dardilly, near Lyon, France, to a devout Catholic farming family. From a young age, John showed a deep love for prayer and a strong desire to become a priest, despite the challenges he faced.

His road to the priesthood was far from easy. St. John Vianney struggled academically, especially with Latin, which was essential for priestly studies. Yet, his unwavering faith, humility, and perseverance eventually led to his ordination in 1815. Shortly after, he was sent to the small, remote village of Ars, France—a place where religious practice had largely been neglected in the wake of the French Revolution.

As the parish priest of Ars, St. John Vianney transformed the community through his tireless dedication to the spiritual welfare of his parishioners. Known for his powerful preaching, profound humility, and deep devotion to the Eucharist, he became a beacon of hope and renewal in the village. His greatest ministry, however, was the confessional. He spent up to 16 hours a day hearing confessions, offering forgiveness, and helping countless souls return to God.

St. John Vianney's life was marked by simplicity, selfdenial, and unwavering trust in God. He frequently fasted and prayed for his parish and for the conversion of sinners. Through his example, many people were inspired to deepen their faith, and Ars became a pilgrimage site during his lifetime.

He passed away on August 4, 1859, after serving the people of Ars for over 40 years. St. John Vianney was canonized by Pope Pius XI in 1925, and in 1929, he was named the patron saint of parish priests. His life continues to inspire clergy and laypeople alike, reminding us of the power of humility, prayer, and pastoral care in bringing others closer to Christ.

# The Baptism of the Lord - Year C

## First Reading

Isaiah 40:1-5, 9-11 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

The glory of the Lord shall be revealed, and all people shall see it.

'Console my people, console them,' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley; then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear, say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God.' Here is the Lord coming with power, his arm subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes.

A reading from the letter of St Paul to Titus

He saved us through the water of rebirth and renewal in the Holy Spirit.

God's grace has been revealed, and it has made salvation possible for the whole human race and taught us that what we have to do is to give up everything that does not lead to God, and all our worldly ambitions; we must be self restrained and live good and religious lives here in this present world, while we are waiting in hope for the blessing which will come with the Appearing of the glory of our great God and saviour Christ Jesus. He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a

people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good.

When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals; he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire.'

Now when all the people had been baptised and while Jesus after his own baptism was at prayer, heaven opened and the Holy Spirit descended on him in bodily shape, like a dove. And a voice came from heaven, 'You are my Son, the Beloved; my favour rests on you.'
