Gospel Reflection

Today's celebration of the Body and Blood of the Lord originated in the Diocese of Liege in 1246 as the feast of Corpus Christi. In the reforms of Vatican II, the feast was joined with the feast of the Precious Blood (July 1) to become the Solemnity of the

Body and Blood of the Lord. Today we celebrate the Christ's gift of the Eucharist, the source and summit of our life together as the Church.

Today's Gospel is Mark's account of the Last Supper. At the Passover meal marking the First Covenant, Jesus, the Lamb of the New Covenant, institutes the New Passover of the Eucharist.

Manly Freshwater Parish's participation in the Northern Beaches Pastoral Discernment Project





The moment the priest disappears.

3 hours. That's how long Padre Pio's Masses would frequently run. Can you imagine that?





meditating on every word, and to be carried out of himself by every action of the rite. He read with emotion, in a low and almost weary voice, unhurriedly, pronouncing each word distinctly... ...Pio seemed to spend ten to fifteen minutes adoring the consecrated bread and wine."

Now I don't know about you, but frankly, I don't think I'd have the stamina.

Still, in all my years serving up on the altar, I have noticed something *curious* about almost all priests I've encountered. When it comes to the words of Consecration – "This is my body... This is my blood" – it seems that all priests tend to slow down and really take their time.

Why though? What's happening here? What am I missing?

Friends, perhaps you already know this, but it's worth repeating:

The Consecration is *THE* essential part of the Mass.

When the priest pronounces the words of Consecration, the bread and wine truly and substantially become the Body and Blood of Christ.

How, you ask? How is this possible? How can a mere man effect such a profound change?

Well, let me explain. Firstly, the priest does *not* act alone. He does not somehow speak and act in his own capacity. No, rather, the priest offering the Holy Sacrifice, instead acts *in persona Christi* (in the person of Christ), and so enjoys a special sacramental identification with Jesus Christ. Indeed, it is only by virtue of the priest speaking the words of consecration ("*This is my body... This is my blood*") that the great miracle takes place.

To put it simply, the priest lends his voice, but Jesus Christ *himself* performs the Consecration.

The priest becomes invisible. Jesus Christ now acts.

So what does this mean for us?

Well, to conclude, I have a confession to make. Two weeks ago, I told you that the Holy Spirit comes down at the *moment* of the first bell (the epiclesis), and the bread and wine changes into the Body and Blood of Christ.

Ah, like the heretics of old, how I've led you astray! Mea maxima culpa.

For while the Holy Spirit does indeed come at this moment, it is in fact immediately *after* the first bell, *during* the words of Consecration, that the transubstantiation takes place. The first bell is a signal, a warning, a preparation, of what's to come. The triple bells signify the miracle.

And so, very simply – when you hear those sacred words, "This is my body... This is my blood", know that you are really and truly hearing the words of Jesus Christ.

And His words are true.





The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ- Year B

First Reading

Exodus 24:3-8 (JB)

A reading from the book of Exodus

This is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you.

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice, 'We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed.' Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, 'We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey.' then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. 'This' he said 'is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules.'

The word of the Lord. *All: Thanks be to God.*

Responsorial Psalm *Ps 115:12-13, 15-18*

R. I will take the cup of salvation, and call on the name of the Lord. How can I repay the Lord for his goodness to me?

The cup of salvation I will raise; I will call on the Lord's name. R.

O precious in the eyes of the Lord is the death of his faithful. Your servant, Lord, your servant am I; you have loosened my bonds. R.

A thanksgiving sacrifice I make: I will call on the Lord's name. My vows to the Lord I will fulfil before all his people. R.

Second Reading Hebrews 9:11-15 (JB)

A reading from the letter to the Hebrews

The blood of Christ will purify our inner selves.

Now Christ has come, as the high priest of all the blessings which were to come. He has passed through the greater, the more perfect tent, which is better than one made by men's hands because it is not of this created order; and he has entered the sanctuary once and for all, taking with him not the blood of goats and bull calves, but his own blood, having won an eternal redemption for us. The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how

much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

He brings a new covenant, as the mediator, only so that the people who were called to an eternal inheritance may actually receive what was promised: his death took place to cancel the sins that infringed the earlier covenant.

Gospel *Mark* 14:12-16, 22-26 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

This is my body. This is my blood.

On the first day of Unleavened Bread, when the Passover lamb was sacrificed, his disciples said to Jesus, 'Where do you want us to go and make the preparations for you to eat the passover?' So he sent two of his disciples, saying to them, 'Go into the city and you will meet a man carrying a pitcher of water. Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, "The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the passover with my disciples?" He will show you a large upper room furnished with couches, all prepared. Make the preparations for us there.' The disciples set out and went to the city and found everything as he had told them, and prepared the Passover.

And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. 'Take it,' he said 'this is my body.' Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, 'This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God.'

After psalms had been sung they left for the Mount of Olives.
