Gospel Reflection

Ordinary Time resumes with the Solemnity of the Holy Trinity. Originating in France in the eighth century, the observance was adopted by the universal Church in 1334. Today's celebration focuses on the essence of our faith: the revelation of God as Creator, the climax of his creation in Jesus the Redeemer, the fullness of the love of God poured out on us in the Sustainer Spirit.

Today's Solemnity of the Holy Trinity celebrates the many ways God makes his presence known in our lives, in the manifestations of his love in our lives and our world. This Sunday of the Trinity invites us to look with a new awareness to behold God in our midst: God is the Father and Creator of all life, including our very selves, who fashions every molecule and atom that nurtures and sustains our lives; God is the Son and the Brother, the Redeemer who teaches us the unfathomable love of the God we seek; God is the Spirit of that love that creates and enables us to break out of the isolation that entraps us and become family and community.

Before returning to God, the Risen Jesus commissions his fledgling church to teach and baptize in the name of the Holy One who reveals himself as Father, Son and Spirit. In faith centered in our covenant with the Triune God we find our identity as the people of God.



THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS.

The hidden treasure - the most unnoticed moment

One of the greatest struggles in the Christian life is when the Lord permits us a trial that we - just don't get. Perhaps it's the death of someone close, or when someone brings out our worst insecurity, or when we battle with a sin that... well, just keeps coming back.



And particularly when this struggle of ours takes time, we can get to a point

where we lose hope, and turn to God, and say "Lord, why don't you just remove this struggle from me? How much longer must I endure it? What good could possibly come from this?!"

Friends, may I propose that there is a *moment* in the Mass that is so helpful for these trials. I mean that. It is an unnoticed moment, almost hidden. A secret gem in the treasure chest, I like to think.

Because each Mass, there's this moment – largely unnoticed – when the acolyte goes over to the credence table, and brings over the bread and wine and water to the altar, for the offering. Sometimes this is done with a procession; other times simply from the credence table. Either way, the bread, water and wine are brought over to the altar.

And I know it seems like such an insignificant moment, but friends, at *this moment*, we, as Christians, can offer ourselves – our very being – every part of us, including our struggles – we can unite *ourselves* to the bread and wine and water. We can unite every part of us: our hopes for the future, our work, our joys, our sufferings, and *especially* our struggles. We can unite our deepest struggles to the offerings of the bread and water and wine.

WE become the offering. WE become the sacrifice, offered up to God, united with the Perfect Sacrifice of Jesus Christ, upon the altar.

Friends, do you not see how profound this is! Do you see what this means! Oh, how I wish I could leap from this page to tell you in the flesh!

When we do this, when we unite *ourselves* to the bread and water and wine, every part of us, including our struggles, then – then – through that great miracle, when the bread and wine becomes the Body and Blood of Christ, then, we can then *receive* Our Lord into that very *place* that we just offered!

Imagine that, the very *place* in us that we just emptied out, that struggle we've been facing, that we empty out and give to God – we then *receive* the Holy Eucharist into that *very place*! Jesus Christ *enters into* the very place that we just emptied!

Not only then does Jesus Christ give us new strength for our trial, but moreover, Our Lord in turn helps us to carry our cross. Try it this week and see what I mean.



First Reading Deuteronomy 4:32-34, 39-40 A reading from the book of Deuteronomy The Lord himself is God in heaven above and on

earth below: there is no other. Moses said to the people: 'Put this question to the ages that are past, that went before you, from the time God created man on earth: Was there ever a word so majestic, from one end of heaven to the other? Was anything ever heard? Did ever a people hear the voice of the living God speaking from the heart of the fire, as you heard it, and remain alive? Has any god ventured to take to himself one nation from the midst of another by ordeals, signs, wonders, war with mighty hand and outstretched arm, by fearsome terrors - all this that the Lord your God did for you before your eyes in Egypt?

'Understand this today, therefore, and take it to heart: The Lord is God indeed, in heaven above as on earth beneath, he and no other. Keep his laws and commandments as I give them to you today so that you and your children may prosper and live long in the land that the Lord your God gives you for ever.'
