

#### **Christmas Message from Fr. Marek**

In an age of extraordinary human achievement, when we dream of sending people to Mars, when reaching higher, going further, and digging deeper has become our norm, we find ourselves tonight gathered around something utterly simple—a humble manger, to honor a little baby, Jesus.

It's not a king's palace, nor even a modest home. The first to greet this Newborn weren't dignitaries or leaders but simple shepherds. Yet, in these unremarkable surroundings, the greatest story ever told began.

Almighty God chose this humble path to enter our world, and therein lies His profound power. Wherever we make room for Him, He transforms the ordinary into something extraordinary, often against all odds.

He did it on the battlefields of the First World War, where enemies sang carols and shared moments of peace. He did it in my own life, the first time I celebrated Christmas far from my family and homeland. And He can do it in your life too—turning small, overlooked moments into something meaningful and beautiful.

But it all begins with making room for Him. Space for Jesus in our homes, in our workplaces, and most importantly, in our hearts. That is the essence of Christmas: welcoming Him and making Him the reason for this season.

So this Christmas, let us do better than the residents of Bethlehem who turned Him away. Let us invite Him into our lives, not just as a guest, but as a true member of our families. May His presence bring you love, peace, and joy. May He transform what is difficult into good and what is good into something even better.

#### The Nativity of the Lord - Eve/Night



First Reading:

Isaiah 9:1-7

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

A son is given to us.

The people that walked in darkness has seen a great light; on those who live in a land of deep shadow a light has shone. You have made their gladness greater, you have made their joy increase; they rejoice in your presence as men rejoice at harvest time, as men are happy when they are dividing the spoils. For the yoke that was weighing on him, the bar across his shoulders, the rod of his oppressor, these you break as on the day of Midian. For all the footgear of battle, every cloak rolled in blood, is burnt and consumed by fire. For there is a child born for us, a son given to us and dominion is laid on his shoulders; and this is the name they give him: Wonder-Counsellor, Mighty-God, Eternal-Father, Prince-of-Peace. Wide is his dominion in a peace that has no end, for the throne of David and for his royal power, which he establishes and makes secure in justice and integrity. From this time onwards and for ever, the jealous love of the Lord of hosts will do this.

He sacrificed himself for us in order to set us free from all wickedness and to purify a people so that it could be his very own and would have no ambition except to do good.

#### Gospel:

Luke 2:1-14 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke *Today a saviour has been born for you.* 

Caesar Augustus issued a decree for a census of the whole world to be taken. This census - the first - took place while Quirinius was governor of Syria, and everyone went to his own town to be registered. So Joseph set out from the town of Nazareth in Galilee and travelled up to Judaea, to the town of David called Bethlehem, since he was of David's House and line, in order to be registered together with Mary, his betrothed, who was with child. While they were there the time came for her to have her child, and she gave birth to a son, her first-born. She wrapped him in swaddling clothes, and laid him in a manger because there was no room for them at the inn. In the countryside close by there were shepherds who lived in the fields and took it in turns to watch their flocks during the night. The angel of the Lord appeared to them and the glory of the Lord shone round them. They were terrified, but the angel said, 'Do not be afraid. Listen, I bring you news of great joy, a joy to be shared by the whole people. Today in the town of David a saviour has been born to you: he is Christ the Lord. And here is a sign for you: you will find a baby wrapped in swaddling clothes and lying in a manger.' And suddenly with the angel there was a great throng of the heavenly host, praising God and singing: 'Glory to God in the highest heaven, and peace to men who enjoy his favour'.

#### The Nativity of the Lord – Day



First Reading: Isaiah 62:11-12 (JB)

A reading from the prophet Isaiah

Your Saviour is born.

This the Lord proclaims to the ends of the earth: Say to the daughter of Zion, 'Look, your saviour comes, the prize of his victory with him, his trophies before him'. They shall be called 'The Holy People', 'The Lord's Redeemed'. And you shall be called 'Thesought-after', 'City-not-forsaken'.

**Responsorial Psalm:** *Ps* 96:1, 6, 11-12 (*JB*)

## R. A light will shine on us this day: the Lord is born for us.

The Lord is king, let earth rejoice, the many coastlands be glad. The skies proclaim his justice; all peoples see his glory. R.

Light shines forth for the just and joy for the upright of heart. Rejoice, you just, in the Lord; give glory to his holy name. R.

#### **Second Reading:** Titus 3:4-7 (JB)

A reading from the letter of St Paul to Titus

His own compassion saved us.

When the kindness and love of God our saviour for mankind were revealed, it was not because he was concerned with any righteous actions we might have done ourselves; it was for no reason except his own compassion that he saved us, by means of the cleansing water of rebirth and by renewing us with the Holy Spirit which he has so generously poured over us through Jesus Christ our saviour. He did this so that we should be justified by his grace, to become heirs looking forward to inheriting eternal life.

Alleluia, alleluia!

Glory to God in the highest, peace to his people on earth.

Gospel: Luke 2:15-20 (JB)

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

The shepherds found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger.

Now when the angels had gone from them into heaven, the shepherds said to one another, 'Let us go to Bethlehem and see this thing that has happened which the Lord has made known to us.' So they hurried away and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby lying in the manger. When they saw the child they repeated what they had been told about him, and everyone who heard it was astonished at what the shepherds had to say. As for Mary, she treasured all these things and pondered them in her heart. And the shepherds went back glorifying and praising God for all they had heard and seen; it was exactly as they had been told.
