Gospel Reflection

Mark holds up both Jairus and the unnamed woman in today's Gospel as models of faith. The message of the two healings is clear: "Do not be afraid; have faith."

The chronically ill woman is so convinced that Jesus not only can help her but **will** help her that she fights her way through the pushing and shoving crowds just to touch the cloak of Jesus. She realizes not only the power of Jesus to heal her but the depth of his love and compassion to **want** to heal her. Her faith is rewarded.

Jairus was a man of considerable authority and stature in the Jewish community. Yet, for the sake of his daughter, he puts aside his pride and his instinctive distrust of an "antiestablishment" rabbi like Jesus and becomes a "beggar" for her before Jesus. Despite the ridicule of the mourners and the depth of his despair, Jesus is Jairus' hope.

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

God's name is what?!

One of my dear friends, for much of her childhood, thought God's name was *Peter*. Why? Well, her father's name was Peter and so she thought all fathers (including God) shared his name. But critically, at the end of each Mass reading.



when the reader said: "The Word of the Lord", she always heard the congregation respond: "Thanks *Peter* God."

Somehow I think God was smiling upon her.

But she's not alone. I saw another young girl recently on YouTube claim to know God's name too. "How do you know His name?" her mother asked. "Well, you know," she said, "Our Father, who art in Heaven, *Howard* be thy name."

Her mother was in stitches.

But you know what, let's be real... that's all of us. How often do we ourselves recite our prayers, but not *know exactly* what it is we say! One of the big ones is the prayer in Mass after the Eucharistic Prayer – we all know it – The 'Our Father'. There's so much we miss.

Let me show you what I mean...

Our Father, who art in Heaven – When Jesus spoke these words, he used the Aramaic word 'Abba' – which best translates to 'Papa' or 'Dad'. Remarkably, God desires us to approach to Him as His children; to run to Him with *full trust* and *confidence*.

Hallowed be thy name – Hallowed means 'holy'. But note here, we don't seek to make *God* holy through *our* prayers... how could we! Rather, we ask that God's name be made holy *in* us – indeed that we might give glory to God through our very lives – our thoughts words and actions.

Thy kingdom come – Ah yes, one of my favourites. We pray that God's kingdom, just as He promised, will come to us. Simply put, we pray that we will reach our ultimate goal – Heaven!

Thy will be done, on earth as it is in Heaven – Our prayer is that God's will be done in us – that we avoid sin, do good, and serve Him – just as He is served by his angels in Heaven.

Give us this day our daily bread – Our 'daily bread' of course means everyday needs – food, clothing, shelter – but so often we forget 'daily bread' in the literal sense. We ask God for the true food of salvation... the Holy Eucharist!

And forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive those who trespass against us – We beseech God to forgive us our sins, and are reminded that, like the servant in the parable, we will *only* be forgiven if we forgive our fellow servant's debts. Woah!

And lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil – Finally we ask God, in his Fatherly love, to free us from the guilt and punishment of sin, and from the snares that the devil and the world set up against us. We rely on God's strength.


Year of Prayer





A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Young girl, I say to you, arise.

When Jesus had crossed in the boat to the other side, a large crowd gathered round him and he stayed by the lakeside. Then one of the synagogue officials came up, Jairus by name, and seeing him, fell at his feet and pleaded with him earnestly, saying, 'My little daughter is desperately sick. Do come and lay your hands on her to make her better and save her life.' Jesus went with him and a large crowd followed him; they were pressing all round him.

Some people arrived from the house of the synagogue official to say, 'Your daughter is dead: why put the Master to any further trouble?' But Jesus had overheard this remark of theirs and he said to the official, 'Do not be afraid; only have faith.' And he allowed no one to go with him except Peter and James and John the brother of James. So they came to the official's house and Jesus noticed all the commotion, with people weeping and wailing unrestrainedly. He went in and said to them, 'Why all this commotion and crying? The child is not dead, but asleep.' But they laughed at him. So he turned them all out and, taking with him the child's father and mother and his own companions, he went into the place where the child lay. And taking the child by the hand he said to her, 'Talitha, kum!' which means, 'little girl, I tell you to get up.' The little girl got up at once and began to walk about, for she was twelve years old. At this they were overcome with astonishment, and he ordered them strictly not to let anyone know about it, and told them to give her something to eat.
