The project aims to understand the challenges and opportunities of our deanery so that we can participate more fully in mission.

Our conversations will inform the development of Bishop Anthony's pastoral mission implementation plan, and they will inform the work of our own parish pastoral council.

Questions for Discernment

1. How can we connect with people who don't identify with a religion and involve them in mission?

2. What ministries are needed to meet the spiritual and pastoral needs of families?

3. What avenues for mission can we provide for young people on the Northern Beaches?

4. How can we improve our outreach to people experiencing disadvantage, and issues like domestic and family violence, mental health and wellbeing challenges, or the effects of the housing affordability crisis?

5. How can we enhance and strengthen Catholic communities on the Northen Beaches?

THINGS YOU DIDN'T KNOW ABOUT THE MASS

The secret hidden in the altar.

When it comes to showing physical affection, Australians can be... a little restrained.

Sure, we have our own way of showing



love. We'll tease, and play games, be cheeky, and joke around. And hey, I love that. I love that about Australians. We show affection through words.

But still... For anyone who's been to Latin America, or Europe, or even the Middle East – you quickly realise how comfortable other cultures are in showing physical affection. To be physically affectionate is natural.

A handshake? Easy. A hug? No big deal. A kiss? That's normal.

And yet for most Australians, we are a little more reserved when it comes to showing physical affection. Sure, we might kiss our close family and friends on the cheek, but a stranger? Hmmm, maybe, maybe not. Depends on the situation. I guess the point I'm trying to make is, a kiss is one of the most loving gestures we can make. It's different. A kiss is special.

... So what's this got to do with the Mass?

+ + +

Friends, at the very start of Mass, one of the first things the priest does is kiss the altar. Before he even speaks a word, the priest processes into the church, bows upon reaching the sanctuary, and then gives the altar a kiss.

Why though? Why does he do this?

Well, two reasons. Firstly, the altar symbolises Christ. The altar is a symbol for Christ. That is why it is usually made of marble - Christ is the "living stone" of the Church (1 Peter 2:4). It is also why we cover the altar with a white cloth - it reminds us of the burial cloth under which Christ was laid. And so the priest kisses the altar, because he fervently desires to show his love and devotion to our Lord. To kiss the altar is to kiss Christ.

Secondly, every altar contains the relics of a saint or martyr. During the first centuries, when the Church suffered horrific persecution, Masses were celebrated in secret, underground in the catacombs, on stone slabs over the tomb of a martyr. However, in the fourth century, when Emperor Constantine legalised Christianity, the Mass moved above-ground, but the tradition of the martyrs remained. Even to this day, every altar must contain the relic of a saint or martyr. And so the priest kisses the altar to reverence those saints and martyrs.

And so, dear friends, what can I say... But don't miss it.

Don't miss your opportunity this week to kiss Christ. To show your great love for Him. Who could forget the kisses of the sinful woman at the Pharisee's house, who didn't cease to kiss Jesus' feet, washing them with her tears? Were not her sins forgiven her, because of her love?

Be not ashamed to kiss Christ. When the priest kisses the altar this Sunday Mass, unite yourself in this moment. Make yours this kiss of Christ.

GOSPEL REFLECTION

The Sea of Galilee is really a land-locked lake 600 feet below sea level. Ravines in the hills and mountains surrounding the Galilee act as natural wind tunnels. In the evening, as the warm air of the day rises above the water, cool air rushes in through the ravines. The effect is amazing: the tranquil lake is whipped into a fury of white-capped six-foot waves. In the midst of this terrorizing experience, Jesus calms both the sea and his disciples' fear.

Mark the evangelist is recounting this story to a terrified and persecuted community. Today's Gospel is intended to reassure them of the Risen Christ's constant presence in the storms they struggle through for the sake of their faith in his reign to come.

A reading from the book of Job

Here I have set the boundaries of the sea.

From the heart of the tempest the Lord gave Job his answer. He said:

Who pent up the sea behind closed doors when it leapt tumultuous out of the womb, when I wrapped it in a robe of mist and made black clouds its swaddling bands; when I marked the bounds it was not to cross and made it fast with a bolted gate? Come thus far, I said, and no farther; here your proud waves shall break.

everlasting.

Some sailed to the sea in ships to trade on the mighty waters. These men have seen the Lord's deeds, the wonders he does in the deep. R.

Then they cried to the Lord in their need and he rescued them from their distress. He stilled the storm to a whisper: all the waves of the sea were hushed. R.

They rejoiced because of the calm and he led them to the haven they desired. Let them thank the Lord for his love, the wonders he does for men. R.

Second Reading 2 Corinthians 5:14-17 (JB)

A reading from the second letter of St Paul to the Corinthians

All things are made new.

The love of Christ overwhelms us when we reflect that if one man has died for all, then all men should be dead; and the reason he died for all was so that living men should live no longer for themselves, but for him who died and was raised to life for them.

From now onwards, therefore, we do not judge anyone by the standards of the flesh. Even if we did once know Christ in the flesh, that is not how we know him now. And for anyone who is in Christ, there is a new creation; the old creation has gone, and now the new one is here. The word of the Lord. **All: Thanks be to God.**

They woke him and said to him, 'Master, do you not care? We are going down!' And he woke up and rebuked the wind and said to the sea, 'Quiet now! Be calm!' And the wind dropped, and all was calm again. Then he said to them, 'Why are you so frightened? How is it that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'
