Gospel Reflection**

Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

Jesus was so dedicated to his mission that his friends felt that he had lost his mind. They had never seen anyone like him, literally! The scribes who opposed him thought that he was possessed by Beelzebul, the prince of the demons. So friends and foes alike had developed an image of Jesus that was far from the truth. While Jesus overlooked the misconception of his friends, he was critical of the scribes' accusation. The scribes' wilful persistence in their misjudgement demonstrates a lack of openness to the truth. It is an expression of pride. Jesus calls this 'blasphemy against the Holy Spirit' and an 'eternal sin', i.e.: a conscious and wilful rejection of the truth despite the truth repeatedly presenting itself for acceptance. Refusal to admit our sinfulness exposes us to such grave spiritual and moral danger. This is the reason why the Lord declares, 'Whoever does the will of God is my brother, sister and mother'.

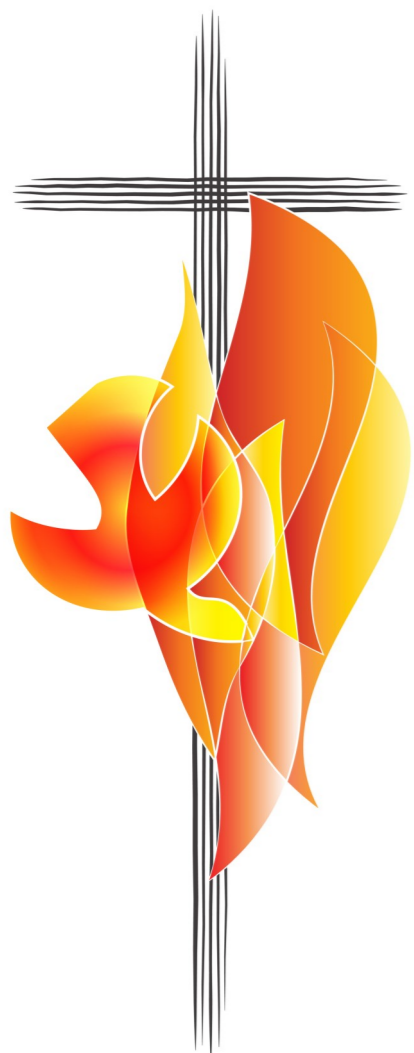

To do this you need to logon to their website [www.kidsguardian.nsw.gov.au], enter your current WWC number and re-enter your details, updating any necessary fields.
