GOSPEL REFLECTION

Today is Palm Sunday, but in Luke's account of Jesus' procession into Jerusalem there are no palms. Luke mentions only that the people spread their cloaks on the road as Jesus entered Jerusalem. The cloak – the outer garment the people wore – was the most valuable item of clothing they possessed, and many people owned only one cloak. They wrapped it around themselves at night as protection from the cold. In placing their cloaks on the ground before Jesus they were offering all they had to the messiah king, entrusting themselves totally to him. To lay down one's cloak before Jesus is a much greater offering than to lay down a palm branch torn off someone else's tree! On this Palm Sunday we are invited to follow the example of Jesus and empty ourselves, embracing true humility. We are invited to remove the cloaks of comfort and self-absorption to take on Christ's spirit of humility and selflessness. What is the cloak that I most need to remove to enable the Messiah to enter the Jerusalem of my heart this Easter-time.

All he asks of us is to 'stay with me for a while'. Having been cleansed and nourished by him, let us try to spend some time with our dear Lord on the eve of his passion.

Easter Ceremonies

After discussions with Fr Raul, Fr Alex, The Parish Liturgy Committee and the Parish Pastoral Council, it has been decided to continue with the same format used the last 3 years for our Easter ceremonies;

Holy Thursday service in our Parish will take place at Tumbi Umbi only, and that the Easter Saturday Vigil service will take place at Wyong only.

This allows the opportunity for the whole parish to come together as one on these two significant occasions and allows our priests the opportunity of concelebrating Mass on the feast of the institution of the priesthood (Holy Thursdays Mass of the Last Supper) and the Mass which many regard as being the most symbolic in our liturgical year (The Easter Saturday Vigil).

Good Friday and Easter Sunday services will still take place at both Tumbi and Wyong as per previous years.

FRIDAY of the PASSION of the LORD Reflection

We know that Jesus saved us by dying on the cross for us, but how was his crucifixion salvific? This is a very important question. If we don't understand the answer we can easily develop a very unhealthy spirituality - one that glorifies pain and suffering as being good in themselves. We may even seek to intensify them in our lives. That is certainly not the will of God.

The cross saves us because it is the supreme expression of God's saving love for humankind. It is love, and love alone, that saves and the saving love of God is most fully revealed on the cross. On the cross divine love and human misery meet, and divine love is victorious. So we should not focus on what Jesus died from (crucifixion). We should focus on what Jesus died for. He died for love of you and me, to give us all a share in eternal life, to unite us with his Father and with each other. He died for love of all of us.
