EASTER CEREMONIES

After discussions with Fr Raul, Fr Alex, The Parish Liturgy Committee and the Parish Pastoral Council, it has been decided to continue with the same format used the last 3 years for our Easter ceremonies;

Holy Thursday service in our Parish will take place at Tumbi Umbi only, and that the Easter Saturday Vigil service will take place at Wyong only.

This allows the opportunity for the whole parish to come together as one on these two significant occasions and allows our priests the opportunity of concelebrating Mass on the feast of the institution of the priesthood (Holy Thursdays Mass of the Last Supper) and the Mass which many regard as being the most symbolic in our liturgical year (The Easter Saturday Vigil).

Good Friday and Easter Sunday services will still take place at both Tumbi and Wyong as per previous years.

GOSPEL REFLECTION JOHN 3:14-21 14th March 2021

Reproduced from God's Word 2021: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

In 598BCE the Babylonian army conquered Jerusalem. The invading soldiers demolished the city walls, burned downed the temple, destroyed buildings and led its leading citizens and artisans off into captivity in Babylon.

In exile the Jews soon realized that while they were captives in body, they did not have to be captives in spirit. The Babylonians could control where they lived but not what they believed. A faithful group of Jews refused to forget their religious heritage. They resisted every effort of their captors to entice them to ridicule their faith. They refused to allow the beauty of Babylon, with its rivers and poplars, to replace in their hearts the beauty of Jerusalem, the holy city. This resistance is well expressed in today's responsorial psalm. It reveals the peoples' immense grief at the loss of their homeland and their resolve never to forget the God of Israel despite the seemingly hopeless situation they were in.

Like the exiles, we can sometimes feel that we are living in an alien land. We are surrounded by a culture that oftentimes does not recognize Christ or Christian values. Like them we can be tempted to forget our religious heritage. We need to remain faithful to Christ not only for ourselves but also for the well-being of all peoples. God loves the world so much and desires that everyone be saved. By our Christian witness we can be instruments through which the saving grace of Christ is communicated to all.


Extract from; MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS POPE FRANCIS FOR LENT 2021

SUNDAY MASS 14TH MARCH 2021 THE LITURGY OF THE WORD

FIRST READING 2 CHRONICLES 36:14-16, 19-23 (YEAR B)

All the heads of the priesthood, and the people too, added infidelity to infidelity, copying all the shameful practices of the nations and defiling the Temple that the Lord had consecrated for himself in Jerusalem. The Lord, the God of their ancestors, tirelessly sent them messenger after messenger, since he wished to spare his people and his house. But they ridiculed the messengers of God, they despised his words, they laughed at his prophets, until at last the wrath of the Lord rose so high against his people that there was no further remedy.

Their enemies burned down the Temple of God, demolished the walls of Jerusalem, set fire to all its palaces, and destroyed everything of value in it. The survivors were deported by Nebuchadnezzar to Babylon; they were to serve him and his sons until the kingdom of Persia came to power. This is how the word of the Lord was fulfilled that he spoke through Jeremiah, 'Until this land has enjoyed its sabbath rest, until seventy years have gone by, it will keep sabbath throughout the days of its desolation.'

And in the first year of Cyrus king of Persia, to fulfil the word of the Lord that was spoken through Jeremiah, the Lord roused the spirit of Cyrus king of Persia to issue a proclamation and to have it publicly displayed throughout his kingdom: 'Thus speaks Cyrus king of Persia, "The Lord, the God of heaven, has given me all the kingdoms of the earth; he has ordered me to build him a Temple in Jerusalem, in Judah. Whoever there is among you of all his people, may his God be with him! Let him go up."

Responsorial Psalm

R. Let my tongue be silenced, if I ever forget you!

SECOND READING EPHESIANS 2:4-10 (YEAR B)

God loved us with so much love that he was generous with his mercy: when we were dead through our sins, he brought us to life with Christ - it is through grace that you have been saved - and raised us up with him and gave us a place with him in heaven, in Christ Jesus.

This was to show for all ages to come, through his goodness towards us in Christ Jesus, how infinitely rich he is in grace. Because it is by grace that you have been saved, through faith; not by anything of your own, but by a gift from God; not by anything that you have done, so that nobody can claim the credit. We are God's work of art, created in Christ Jesus to live the good life as from the beginning he had meant us to live it.

GOSPEL JOHN 3:14-21 (YEAR B)

Jesus said to Nicodemus:

'The Son of Man must be lifted up as Moses lifted up the serpent in the desert, so that everyone who believes may have eternal life in him. Yes, God loved the world so much that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believed in him may not be lost but may have eternal life. For God sent his Son into the world not to condemn the world, but so that through him the world might be saved. No one who believes in him will be condemned; but whoever refuses to believe is condemned already, because he has refused to believe in the name of God's only Son. On these grounds is sentence pronounced: that though the light has come into the world men have shown they prefer darkness to the light because their deeds were evil. And indeed, everybody who does wrong hates the light and avoids it, for fear his actions should be exposed; but the man who lives by the truth comes out into the light, so that it may be plainly seen that what he does is done in God.'
