

THIRD SUNDAY OF EASTER 15th April 2018 Year B Gospel Reflection Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

Today's liturgy invites us to appreciate lovingly the riches of the Paschal mystery which is the sum total of the work of creation and redemption, of all the reality of man and of all the revelation of God. For the believer, every Eucharistic celebration renews the presence of Christ who died and rose again. Jesus comes into the midst of the Christians assembled for the Eucharistic celebration and through the Eucharist he makes them touch his body, his real presence. Christ is also present and communicates through the Scriptures and through his witnesses who are sent to proclaim the forgiveness of sins. The Apostles, who would witness to the Risen Lord and would call the people to conversion, are themselves now full of fear, doubt and diffidence. But the Lord appears to them and clears away their doubt, inspires and enlightens them and leads them to understand the Scriptures where everything was foretold. The Lord eats with them and proclaims that in his name will be preached to all nations the message of conversion and forgiveness of sins. The Apostles would soon begin this task very faithfully. Wherever people accept the call to conversion and wherever pardon from God and interpersonal pardon among people take place, there the Paschal victory of Jesus bears fruit.

The Gospels inform us that Jesus and the Apostles sang at the Last Supper, and the Apostle Paul exhorted the early Church communities to sing psalms, hymns and spiritual songs with thankful hearts when they gathered (cf. Mt 26:30; Mk 14:26; Col 3:16).

Triple "T" Family Group (Toddlers, Teens and Old Timers)

We have approximately 16 families in our Family Group at present....a good mix of adults and children. We are a friendly and supportive bunch, and we socialize frequently and regularly. Every Sunday after Mass usually a group of us gather at Mingara for Morning Tea...some call it "Breakfast" !! Not everyone is always available, nor is it compulsory, so numbers can vary say between six and twenty.....

Every month we have an outing/event, and each family has a turn to "host" it. (By "hosting" the event does not mean much preparation, nor expense. It means mainly to remind everyone that it is on.) We have a list of all members, and most often the reminders are by word of mouth, though we do have phone numbers/emails.

Examples of these outings are: Fish & Chips or a Picnic somewhere nice; Games (Charades, Crazy Whist, Trivia etc.) Day at a members' home. (Bring a plate); Lunch out at ,e.g. 16fts Club at Belmont; 10 Pin Bowling; Home Mass and Pot Luck Dinner; Car Trial; Barbeque/Picnic near Christmas.

We have a General Meeting (very informal) at the start of each year, and we decide who's doing what and where...all voluntary, no obligation. Our aim is NO COST or LOW COST. And at any time we are all together at someone's home, we all 'bring a plate'. Special Birthdays or Anniversaries are another highlight and a source of good fun and surprises.

We are a wonderful group "we are family" Lots of love and laughter, and most importantly, SUPPORT.
