REFLECTION 1.9.2024—22nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's readings lead us to reflect not just on the rules we live by but on how and why we keep them. Ideally, rules are meant to allow us to live safely and freely. If children understand this early, then they readily learn how to care for themselves and for others.

Society has rules that are for our protection and harmony – look at what happens to people and our environment when rules are ignored. Religious rules are meant to nurture our relationship with God. Moses encourages the people to see God's law as a gift which, when understood, brings wisdom and life. James and Jesus say this will only come about if we live the law from our hearts. Only then will we act with justice, speak the truth and help those in need. The law will bear good fruit in us. Today we are challenged to match our actions to our faith and check if we really live as if God's law is all about love. Do we live by the law of love in our minds and in our hearts?

Upcoming Saint Feast Days: September

3rd September—St Gregory The Great

Gregory is known best for his contributions to the liturgy. He reformed the Mass and the daily prayer of the Church and wrote prayers we still use today as well as commentaries on Scripture that shaped theology through the Middle Ages. He also collected melodies of plain

chant used in the liturgy—today that style is known as Gregorian chant, after him.

Gregory is one of the four great doctors of the Church, along with St. Ambrose, St. Augustine, and St. Jerome. These four and 33 other doctors have been singled out for their ability to articulate and teach the faith.

5th September—St Teresa of Calcutta

Saint Teresa of Calcutta (known as Mother Teresa) was an Albanian-born Indian Roman Catholic missionary and nun who devoted her life to helping those most in need. She founded the Missionaries of Charity in India in 1950, and for over 45 years, she ministered to the poor, sick, orphaned and dying.

6th September—Ember Day

The Ember Days are special days for prayer and fasting during the liturgical year.

They correspond to the four seasons, and they focus our attention especially on the blessings of nature. On the Ember Days, we give thanks for blessings we've received, but also remind ourselves of our need for penance and grace.

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

The Pharisees and some of the scribes who had come from Jerusalem gathered round Jesus, and they noticed that some of his disciples were eating with unclean hands, that is, without washing them. For the Pharisees, and the Jews in general, follow the tradition of the elders and never eat without washing their arms as far as the elbow; and on returning from the market place they never eat without first sprinkling themselves. There are also many other observances which have been handed down to them concerning the washing of cups and pots and bronze dishes. So these Pharisees and scribes asked him, 'Why do your disciples not respect the tradition of the elders but eat their food with unclean hands?' He answered, 'It was of you hypocrites that Isaiah so rightly prophesied in this passage of scripture:

This people honours me only with lip-service,

while their hearts are far from me.

The worship they offer me is worthless,

the doctrines they teach are only human regulations.

You put aside the commandment of God to cling to human traditions.'

He called the people to him again and said, 'Listen to me, all of you, and understand. Nothing that goes into a man from outside can make him unclean; it is the things that come out of a man that make him unclean. For it is from within, from men's hearts, that evil intentions emerge: fornication, theft, murder, adultery, avarice, malice, deceit, indecency, envy, slander, pride, folly. All these things come from within and make a man unclean.'

A catechist is a person who gifts an hour or more each week to the Catholic children who attend the public schools. We have 4 public primary schools in our parish. The schools are Ettalong PS, Woy Woy PS, Woy Woy South PS and Umina PS.

The catechists prepare and present lessons from the Walking With Jesus programme, to the

children. These lesson are about what it means to be a Catholic Christian. They are based on the Holy Scriptures and the teaching of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

How Do You Become A Catechist?

- -Pray about becoming a catechist
- -Meet with the parish catechist co-ordinator and discuss the schools that need catechists and catechist assistants
- -Meet with the parish priest and talk with him about being a catechist
- -Set aside the time and the day of the week for which you are available to attend the school or schools.
- -Apply for a Working With Children Check
- -Complete some paperwork
- -Complete some training which will equip you with knowledge of the ministry, inform you of the programme, Walking with Jesus, which is used to teach the Catholic children of the parish attending the public schools in your parish
- -Begin working in the ministry of taking the Good News of Jesus to the children in the schools as an assistant catechist, or if you have had experience of teaching children previously, as a catechist.
- -Catechist contact details

As a Catechist, What Support Is There For Me?

- -Begin your ministry by assisting an experienced catechist in the class she or he teaches and let the catechists mentor you to develop teaching skills.
- -Arrange a visit to the CCD Regional Resource Centre to meet the CCD staff who will be able to show you the resources that are available for you.
- -Get a copy of the Walking With Jesus teacher's manual and student workbook.
- -Attend further training which will give you more skills to become an effective teacher. Training is done via zoom so you can participate in the comfort of your own home. If you do not have a computer, your coordinator could arrange for you to access one in the parish or CCD can accommodate you at the resource centre at The Entrance.




