

Gospel Reflection Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

Jesus outlines the characteristics of an authentic shepherd and shows how we can recognise him: see his total dedication to the point of giving his life. Jesus is the real Good Shepherd, in contrast to all those who solemnly claim to be leaders and guides of the people but actually are in search of power and pelf. Only Jesus the Good Shepherd, who is not a paid servant, knows his sheep and has offered his life in order to snatch them away from the wolves which try to plunder and disperse them. The interest and care of this Shepherd is not limited to the sheep that are with him; there are other sheep, dispersed and far, which he wants to gather so that the shepherd and all the sheep would be united.

The allegory of the Shepherd reflects directly the person and the mission of Christ. His voluntary offering of life for his sheep is the reason for which the Father loves him. The sheep definitively belong to the Father; he who gives his life for the sheep is loved by the Father. The principle of belonging to the sheepfold is that of mutual belonging and true communion between the shepherd and the sheep. It should be a communion as deep and indissoluble as the communion between the Father and the Son.



On April 25th, all around Australia, in Churches and at various shrines of remembrance and War Memorials, people will gather to honour those men and women who have gone off to war. It is the dawn of another ANZAC DAY. It is a day of remembrance of the deaths and sufferings in war, the valour of fighting women and men and the ever present hope for the people of the world to live together in harmony and lasting peace.
