

Gospel Reflection for The Most Holy Body & **Blood of Christ**

Luke's Gospel narrates a number of episodes that evoke the Eucharist. The beautiful post resurrection evening meal at Emmaus is one such. Today's passage is another. Jesus welcomes the people, cures those in need of healing, speaks to them of the kingdom of God, and feeds them abundantly in the lonely place.

Paul's presentation of the institution of the Eucharist is the earliest written account we have. He wrote as a corrective to the selfish behaviour of the Corinthian community at their celebrations. They showed no regard for one another, no replication of Jesus' hospitality, no care for those in need, no focus on the kingdom of God. They were blind to the fact that Jesus shared the bread as a sign of his life given for his sisters and brothers.

Today's solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ challenges us to examine our lives. Does our participation in the Eucharist bear fruit in self-giving in daily life?

Body and Blood of Christ The feast of Corpus Christi focuses on the Eucharist as a symbol and sacrament of unity. While we celebrate the Eucharist every Sunday, today we give special consideration to the Bread of Life nourishing our lives. When we break bread and share the one cup we recall that sacred meal between Christ and his disciples just before sacrificing his life on a cross. Like those disciples, Christ's death and resurrection has bonded us in a love relationship. For this reason, the Eucharist is never a private affair but always a call to unity. In receiving communion today, be aware of Christ's presence not only in the Eucharistic host, but in those receiving with you
