

2nd Sunday of Lent 25th February 2018 Year B **Gospel Reflection** Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

The observation of the English mystic poet William Blake that 'great things happen when men and mountains meet' is true of such pivotal events in the Hebrew and Christian Scriptures as Moses' reception of the Ten Commandments on Mt Sinai and the transfiguration of Jesus 'on a high mountain'. In the latter instance, as recorded by all three synoptic writers and now included in the luminous mysteries of the rosary by St John Paull II, Jesus is revealed as the long-awaited Messiah. Accompanied by representatives of the Law and the Prophets (Moses and Elijah), he is transfigured in the presence of Peter, James and John. His human bodiliness becomes the vehicle through which his inner reality as God-Man shines forth. Surely, this was a source of hope to his disciples after Jesus' prediction of his death by crucifixion became a reality. Alluding to this event Peter wrote: 'We had been eyewitnesses of his majesty...while we were with him on the holy mountain' (2 Pet 1:16-18).

One of the beautiful faith traditions is the Stational Mass a special opportunity that offers a way to greater prayer with the universal Church during particular seasons throughout the year.




