

Reflection

Both the Hebrew and the Christian Scriptures assign special roles to spiritual beings called angels—'godsends' whose saving missions have been captured so beautifully by some of the world's greatest artists. Most notable among these 'godsends' are the three archangels whose feast we celebrate today—Michael the protector, Raphael the spiritual guide (read the delightful Book of Tobit) and Gabriel the bringer of good news (to Zechariah and Mary).

Their specific missions point to the ways in which our loving God intervenes in human history and in our own daily lives—often in the person of a friend, a mentor or a family member but sometimes in a chance acquaintance. Though angels may not occupy the honoured place they once did in popular devotions, we continue to refer to them in the text of the Mass. Today we might reassess the part that God's angels play in our spiritual life, especially that angel who, as the Church teaches, is our personal guardian.

REFLECTION 26TH SEPTEMBER Mk 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

Reproduced from God's Word 2021: Daily Reflections, published by St Pauls Publications, Strathfield

Scripture scholars (perhaps with John 6: 60 in mind) sometimes refer to the 'hard sayings' of Jesus aspects of his teaching which may, at first glance, seem unduly demanding, even unreasonable, to his would-be disciples. In interpreting these 'hard sayings', we must make allowance for the fact that Jesus is sometimes speaking metaphorically and using Semitic hyperbole. If we take literally (as doubtless some people have done) Jesus' words, If your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out, we may find ourselves like Dickens's irascible schoolmaster, Wackford Squeers, who had but one eye, and the popular prejudice runs in favour of two'. As we reflect on Jesus' 'hard sayings' in today's Gospel reading, we may feel rather discouraged. Even despite our best efforts, our life of faith falls far short of the ideal that he proposes. At such times we need to turn to the God who is rich in mercy and pray like the father of the boy from whom Jesus expelled an unclean spirit—'1 do have faith. Help the little faith I have!' (Mark 9: 24). Take heart and say with Paul: 'There is nothing I cannot master with the help of the One who gives me strength.' (Philippians 4:13).

FIRST READING NUMBERS 11:25-29

The Lord came down in the Cloud. He spoke with Moses, but took some of the spirit that was on him and put it on the seventy elders. When the spirit came on them they prophesied, but not again.

Two men had stayed back in the camp; one was called Eldad and the other Medad. The spirit came down on them; though they had not gone to the Tent, their names were enrolled among the rest. These began to prophesy in the camp. The young man ran to tell this to Moses, 'Look,' he said 'Eldad and Medad are prophesying in the camp.' Then said Joshua the son of Nun, who had served Moses from his youth, 'My Lord Moses, stop them!' Moses answered him, 'Are you jealous on my account? If only the whole people of the Lord were prophets, and the Lord gave his Spirit to them all!'

An answer for the rich. Start crying, weep for the miseries that are coming to you. Your wealth is all rotting, your clothes are all eaten up by moths. All your gold and your silver are corroding away, and the same corrosion will be your own sentence, and eat into your body. It was a burning fire that you stored up as your treasure for the last days. Labourers mowed your fields, and you cheated them - listen to the wages that you kept back, calling out; realise that the cries of the reapers have reached the ears of the Lord of hosts. On earth you have had a life of comfort and luxury; in the time of slaughter you went on eating to your heart's content. It was you who condemned the innocent and killed them; they offered you no resistance.

GOSPEL MARK 9:38-43, 45, 47-48

John said to Jesus, 'Master, we saw a man who is not one of us casting out devils in your name; and because he was not one of us we tried to stop him.' But Jesus said, 'You must not stop him: no one who works a miracle in my name is likely to speak evil of me. Anyone who is not against us is for us.

'If anyone gives you a cup of water to drink just because you belong to Christ, then I tell you solemnly, he will most certainly not lose his reward.

'But anyone who is an obstacle to bring down one of these little ones who have faith, would be better thrown into the sea with a great millstone round his neck. And if your hand should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life crippled, than to have two hands and go to hell, into the fire that cannot be put out. And if your foot should cause you to sin, cut it off; it is better for you to enter into life lame, than to have two feet and be thrown into hell. And if your eye should cause you to sin, tear it out; it is better for you to enter into the kingdom of God with one eye, than to have two eyes and be thrown into hell where their worm does not die nor their fire go out.'

Vox Populi - The Voice of the People

This week's message comes from Melissa Glavin. Melissa is the Foster Care Support, Assessment & Recruitment Officer for CatholicCare, Diocese of Broken Bay.

My Christian calling to protect the vulnerable By Melissa Glavin

Every baptised Christian is uniquely called by God, to holiness of life and to mission in the Church for the sake of God's Kingdom in the world. In this sense, every Christian has a vocation.

When I started working in child protection and out of home care almost two decades ago, I realised from the beginning that my heart was captured by the opportunities in front of me. I began to see the ways in which God could use His Church to redeem brokenness and restore families in incredibly beautiful ways. I knew there was no turning back and that working with vulnerable children and families was my vocation. I knew that I was called by God to do this work.

I currently have the privilege of working for CatholicCare, Diocese of Broken Bay as the Principal Foster Care Support, Recruitment and Assessment Officer. I work alongside and support Foster Carers who care for children and young people that had to be moved out of their homes through no fault of their own in order to provide safety and stability. A Foster Carer's role is to provide a nurturing, safe environment for children and young people in families in need of help, until the children can be reunited with their families. Some children and young people unfortunately cannot return home, which means some Foster Carers make a long-term commitment to a child or young person in their care.

Should other Christians consider working in Foster Care? Yes, most certainly. Christians should prayerfully consider Foster Care. Not that everyone will want to work as a front-line worker, such as myself. Others may be able to become Foster Carers themselves, if it is God's will. Christians should at least be open to these possibilities and pray for discernment for their own vocation.

Christians should consider Foster Care because we are called to be salt and light in the world (Matthew 5:13–14). Foster parents are difference-makers. Taking in a foster child may not change the world, but it will change the world for that child.

Being a Foster Carer is a wonderful way to demonstrate their love of Christ. Jesus Christ had compassion on the "harassed and helpless" multitudes (Matthew 9:36); He received children to bless them (Mark 10:16); He taught us to love our neighbors as ourselves (Mark 12:31).

Christians should consider Foster Care because of God's commands to care for the vulnerable and most in need. "Defend the weak and the fatherless" (Psalm 82:3; cf. Isaiah 1:17). Protecting vulnerable children shows the heart of God.

James tells us that "Pure and undefiled religion before God the Father is this: to look after orphans and widows in their distress and to keep oneself unstained from the world" (James 1:27). I have held this verse close to my heart, during my Foster Care journey.

Here to help at home

Local aged care provider, Catholic Healthcare, continues to deliver in-home services to older people in the community.

"Home Care is considered an essential service," says Nicola Rosenthal, Regional Manager, Home & Community Services. "All Home Care services are continuing as normal except for our Wellness Centre at Hamlyn Terrace.

"We are monitoring Government advice and keeping up-to-date with changing restrictions. We have comprehensive COVID-19 protocols in place to minimise risk for clients and staff. Protocols include updated mandatory staff training on infection control and handwashing; mask wearing; pre-visit screening; and reminding staff to stay home if they are unwell. We are also actively encouraging staff and clients to be vaccinated for COVID-19."

The Catholic Healthcare team can provide extra shopping and social support.

"Our Community Workers can accompany and transport clients to their local grocery store or help make purchases online. If clients would prefer to remain in their homes, we can do their shopping and drop it off at their home.

"Our teams have also adjusted our social support groups and can move these to one-on-one connection. We can organise check in phone calls from one of our caring team members or volunteers to help support social, emotional, and spiritual wellbeing."

Catholic Healthcare's local team can provide COVID-safe support for older people struggling with possessions and assist with decluttering. They are also offering a program, Buried in Treasures, which commences on 30th of August. Please go to <u>Buried In Treasures</u> (catholichealthcare.com.au) to register - please note you do have to be over a certain age to attend.

Staff are also available to walk through the My Aged Care website, to discuss aged care options.

"Our Care Advisors are available to assist you," says Nicola. "They can speak to you via video conferencing, by phone or if preferred, in person at your home. Please call 1800 225 474."
