Gospel Reflection

Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

Like the other evangelists, Mark records many occasions in which Jesus heals people stricken with serious illnesses and brings wholeness to people handicapped by bodily defects. In today's gospel it is Peter's mother-in-law who is the subject of his compassionate ministrations. Mark goes a step further in proclaiming the Good News by highlighting how frequently Jesus also brings freedom to those who are bedevilled and enslaved by maladies that afflict the human spirit. In our lives this servitude can take many forms—destructive addictions, compulsive behaviour, habits of serious sin, envy of others, greed, self-centredness and bigotry, to mention just a few. Committed to amending our lives in whatever impedes our relationship with God and our neighbour, let us humbly stand before Jesus and ask for healing of mind, body and spirit and release from our personal demons. In this connection, Paul offers us good advice: 'Stand fast therefore in the liberty with which Christ has made us free, and be not entangled again with the yoke of bondage'.



Gospel Reflection

Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

The three readings are held together by a common thread: harmony of action and purpose. In the first reading, God puts His words in His prophet's mouth that he would tell the people everything He commands. The second reading speaks about being free to please the Lord through 'undivided devotion in body and spirit'. The Gospel speaks about how Jesus 'taught them as one who had authority'. Jesus' authority proceeds from the unity of two wills: the Father's will and his. To have a personal experience of this man called Jesus is to have a personal relationship with his Father, our Father. For indeed, we know the giver from the gift, the greatness of the artist from the art, the skill of the cook from the food. To be gripped by Jesus becomes a great event only when we say with him, 'Father, may your will be done'.
