Gospel Reflection

Luke is the author of our first reading from Acts, and also of the Gospel passage. In both he speaks of Jesus' being lifted up to the Father; promising his disciples the gift of the Holy Spirit who would clothe them with the power from on high; and commissioning them to be his witnesses to the ends of the earth. Further, Acts and the letter to the Hebrews instill the expectation that the ascending Jesus will appear a second time, will come back to our world to reward with salvation those who are waiting for him.

In the meantime, we are to keep firm in the hope we profess, because the one who made the promise is faithful. Our expectation is not a passive experience. We are not to stand looking up into the sky. Rather, clothed with power from on high, we are to be active witnesses to Jesus, his teaching and his saving act. He is alive. Through us, he wants to continue to tell the world about the kingdom of God.
