
Jesus encourages his listeners to pursue utter integrity, to acknowledge their own failings and look gently upon the faults of their neighbour. The challenge is to cultivate authenticity in our internal dispositions so that we bear good fruit in our actions and in our words.

To the first reading As a prelude to the gospel, the extract from the Book of Sirach focuses on words and conversations as being illustrative of a person's thoughts and character. Just as a kiln tests the work of the potter and the tree is judged on the quality of its fruit, so are a person's words a test of their character.

To the second reading The impetus and motivation to become people of integrity is found in St Paul's words to the Corinthians. It is a battle call to persist at doing the Lord's work and to resist defeat, in the assurance that this labour is not in vain. Victory has been given to God's people through Jesus' triumph over death.

Looking inwardly - acting outwardly The gospel today presents three unrelated sayings of Jesus which outline the qualities of a true follower of Jesus. The unifying theme is integrity - being honest and sincere with oneself and rejecting all forms of deception, superficiality, falseness or hypocrisy. In questioning the sense of a blind man leading the blind, Jesus is speaking to the importance of leaders having experienced a situation themselves before presuming to guide other people.

The instruction to remove the log from one's own eye before commenting on the splinter in another's eye, is a clear call to judge self and others honestly and fairly. Jesus speaks disparagingly of people who ignore their own failings while focusing on the faults of others and refers to them as 'hypocrites', a word which had previously been reserved for the Pharisees and scribes. Finally, in declaring that a good tree cannot bear bad fruit, and that a bad tree cannot bear good fruit, Jesus is emphasising that inward dispositions manifest themselves in external words and actions.
