Gospel Reflection Excerpt from; God's Word 2018: Daily Reflections

Giving them his Spirit, Jesus gives his Apostles the power to remit sins; thus he makes human beings participate in his triumph over evil and sin. The risen Lord gives Thomas, who did not believe the testimony of his fellow Apostles, a lesson which is significant also for us: it is necessary to pass from vision to faith. The new mode of life of the Risen Lord means that he cannot be known as an earthly man, but as one who is present to us in the sacraments and in the life of the Church.

Today's liturgy proclaims that each one of us is regenerated to a living hope through the Resurrection of Christ. Nearly every day we die to something: our ego, a dream, an ambition, an old idea - in order to rise with a greater ability to love, to welcome the reality around us, to be enthusiastic in continuing the adventure of our lives. The mystery of death and resurrection goes on. The Resurrection, therefore, is not only a fact of past history but also a present reality. In our life, after every crisis we begin again; after every rupture we rebuild. Through all these experiences the Lord teaches us how to go forward, and prepares the way for us to arrive at the final death and resurrection. In this pilgrimage the Christian must be characterised by faith in the Resurrection, being conscious that the present moment is a passage from death to life.



Triple "T" Family Group (Toddlers, Teens and Old Timers)

We have approximately 16 families in our Family Group at present....a good mix of adults and children. We are a friendly and supportive bunch, and we socialize frequently and regularly. Every Sunday after Mass usually a group of us gather at Mingara for Morning Tea...some call "Breakfast" !! Not everyone is always available, nor is it compulsory, so numbers can vary say between six and twenty.....

Every month we have an outing/event, and each family has a turn to "host" it. (By "hosting" the event does not mean much preparation, nor expense. It means mainly to remind everyone that it is on.) We have a list of all members, and most often the reminders are by word of mouth, though we do have phone numbers/emails.

Examples of these outings are: Fish & Chips or a Picnic somewhere nice: Games (Charades, Crazy Whist, Trivia etc.) Day at a members' home. (Bring a plate); Lunch out at ,e.g. 16fts Club at Belmont; 10 Pin Bowling; Home Mass and Pot Luck Dinner; Car Trial; Barbeque/Picnic near Christmas.

We have a General Meeting (very informal) at the start of each year, and we decide who's doing what and where...all voluntary, no obligation. Our aim is NO COST or LOW COST. And at any time we are all together at someone's home, we all 'bring a plate'. Special Birthdays or Anniversaries are another highlight and a source of good fun and surprises.

We are a wonderful group "we are family" Lots of love and laughter, and most importantly, SUPPORT.
