REFLECTION 8.9.2024—23rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

There are many stories about Jesus healing someone in need. Today a deaf man with a speech impediment is brought to Jesus. How blessed that man was to have friends who wanted the best for him! I am reminded of a cousin who was born unable to hear or speak but, because his parents understood the value of early childhood intervention, he was given the best possible start in life. He developed various forms of communication that in time enabled him to support himself through work, qualify as a sporting umpire and travel the world.

Sometimes we just need others to enable us to be the best we can be. Jesus gave the deaf man his full attention - he took him aside in private and by word and action opened him to a new way of living. Further he didn't want the deaf man to tell others about him because he wanted all the attention to be on the man's wellbeing rather than on himself. Jesus does all things well and gives the man hope for the future. Have there been moments in my life where I have led others to freedom because I have enabled them to see and feel the power of God? Or perhaps someone has led me? This could be a valuable reflection for today.

Upcoming Saint Feast Days: September

7th September—Saturday Mass Nativity of the Virgin Mary

The Catholic Church celebrates today the birth of the Blessed Virgin Mary on its traditional fixed date of September 8, nine months after the December 8 celebration of her Immaculate Conception as the child of Saints Joachim and Anne.

9th September—St Peter Claver

The Memorial of St. Peter Claver, who ministered to enslaved Africans. St. Peter Claver was a Jesuit priest from Catalonia who served African slaves in Cartagena, Colombia for thirty-eight years, baptizing over 300,000.

12th September – The Most Holy Name of Mary

The Most Holy Name of Mary feast day honors Mary, the Mother of God, as blessed. It takes place each year on **September 12th**, four days after the feast of the Birth of the Blessed Mother. The feast day

encourages us all to pray for her intercession to deepen our love of Christ and our relationship with the Lord.

14th September—The Exaltation of The Holy Cross

The liturgical Feast of the Exaltation of the Holy Cross carries immense theological significance. It underscores the core teachings of the Catholic Church, encapsulating the mystery of the Cross as an instrument of God's boundless love, mercy, and redemption.






Gospel Mark 7:31-37

He took him aside in private, away from the crowd, put his fingers into the man's ears and touched his tongue with spittle. Then looking up to heaven he sighed; and he said to him, 'Ephphatha,' that is, 'Be opened.' And his ears were opened, and the ligament of his tongue was loosened and he spoke clearly. And Jesus ordered them to tell no one about it, but the more he insisted, the more widely they published it. Their admiration was unbounded. Who Are The Catechists And What Do They Do?

A catechist is a person who gifts an hour or more each week to the Catholic children who attend the public schools. We have 4 public primary schools in our parish. The schools are Ettalong PS, Woy Woy PS, Woy Woy South PS and Umina PS.

The catechists prepare and present lessons from the Walking With Jesus programme, to the

children. These lesson are about what it means to be a Catholic Christian. They are based on the Holy Scriptures and the teaching of the Catechism of the Catholic Church.

Why Do People Volunteer To Be Catechists?

As a volunteer catechist, you will be talking the Good News that Jesus suffered death and rose to new life, conquering death and sin for all of us and to extend the invitation to the children to become disciples of Jesus.

As a catechist you learn more about yourself and your faith. It is an opportunity for you to give back a little of what you have been given. You will gain confidence, make a difference to the lives of the children they teach and to their families. You will meet interesting like-minded people and become an active member of the parish community as well as learning new skills and bringing new life to your faith.

Take on the challenge! Step out in faith and let the Holy Spirit lead you in this wonderful ministry. Have fun: Well, enjoy yourself to the fullest.

How Do You Become A Catechist?

- -Pray about becoming a catechist
- -Meet with the parish catechist co-ordinator and discuss the schools that need catechists and catechist assistants
- -Meet with the parish priest and talk with him about being a catechist
- -Set aside the time and the day of the week for which you are available to attend the school or schools.
- -Apply for a Working With Children Check
- -Complete some paperwork
- -Complete some training which will equip you with knowledge of the ministry, inform you of the programme, Walking with Jesus, which is used to teach the Catholic children of the parish attending the public schools in your parish
- -Begin working in the ministry of taking the Good News of Jesus to the children in the schools as an assistant catechist, or if you have had experience of teaching children previously, as a catechist.

As a Catechist, What Support Is There For Me?

- -Begin your ministry by assisting an experienced catechist in the class she or he teaches and let the catechists mentor you to develop teaching skills.
- -Arrange a visit to the CCD Regional Resource Centre to meet the CCD staff who will be able to show you the resources that are available for you.
- -Get a copy of the Walking With Jesus teacher's manual and student workbook.
- -Attend further training which will give you more skills to become an effective teacher. Training is done via zoom so you can participate in the comfort of your own home. If you do not have a computer, your coordinator could arrange for you to access one in the parish or CCD can accommodate you at the resource centre at The Entrance.
