

Gospel Reflection for Pentecost Sunday

Today we celebrate Pentecost as the second of the seven solemnities, liturgical highpoints, falling in June of this year. Ascension and Pentecost are at the very heart of our faith. The apostles were all filled with the Holy Spirit when the tongues of fire rested on them as Pentecost. They 'possessed the Spirit of God' Jesus and Paul describe this reality as the Father, the Son and the Spirit making their home in them, in us. Moved by the indwelling Spirit, we are sons and daughters, crying out 'Abba, Father!. This is powerfully intimate. Home. Family. Sons or daughters. In our human experience, all of these are inevitably imperfect. Not so in the Spirit.

Paul insists that 'If we are children we are heirs as well: heirs of God and coheirs with Christ, sharing his sufferings so as to share his glory'. Christian life is not exempt from sufferings. Indeed, it often brings its own sufferings. But we are coheirs with the crucified and risen Jesus. The Spirit living in us will give a deep down joy.

The Church distinguishes between the 'large' sign of the cross (made with right hand outstretched on forehead, chest and shoulders) and the 'small' sign of the cross (made with the thumb on forehead, mouth and chest). With this latter action just prior to the reading of the Gospel, we are asking God's blessing upon our thoughts, words and desires. Next time you make this sign, be aware that you are praying to open yourself to God's Word.
