#### **REFLECTION 9.6.2024** — 10th Sunday in Ordinary Time

The most successful sporting teams in history are the ones in which the players have high levels of trust in each other, inclusive communication and task-focused goals. For a long time, the New Zealand All Blacks have been the premier rugby team in the world. A key formula to their success was the attention given to completing small tasks such as 'sweeping the sheds' after games, practicing the art of humility and being accountable to one another.

In today's Gospel, we read of how a solid household cannot be divided or destroyed. Jesus is clear in his message that a divided household (or team for that matter) will crumble under pressure. However, the good news is that Jesus invites us into a different pathway - a pathway of strength, inclusivity and hope. How strong is your household, whether it be your family, community or workplace? What little actions can you perform to raise the group's morale and cohesion?

## Parish Pastoral Council

The current constitution of the Parish Pastoral Council was accepted at a meeting of the Council on Tuesday, 10 April 2018. This must be updated to meet the changes which have occurred in the last six years to the parish dynamics, as well as meeting the challenges for the future.

Meaningful discussions will be necessary in 24/25 council year for our parish to flourish as we move forward. Some of these issues include plans and programs which encourage new and lapsed Catholics as they consider their place as practicing members of our parish; the installation of St Cecilia's relic in November; and considerations and consequences if the carpark is sold.

To enable this new constitution to be prepared and accepted (under the current

constitution rules) the Annual General Meeting of the PPC has been transferred to Tuesday August 13.

These timeline changes also are required:

Written or personal expression of interest should be given to one of our priests or the parish office now close on **Friday, 28 June.** 

PPC Meeting on 9 July.

At this meeting the new constitution will be finalised and endorsed. All interested future PPC members will be invited to this meeting.

All council members will be advised in the Parish Bulletin on 10/11 August and Office Bearers on 17/18 August.

#### Gospel - Mark 3:20-35

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark

Jesus went home, and such a crowd collected that they could not even have a meal. When his relatives heard of this, they set out to take charge of him, convinced he was out of his mind.

The scribes who had come down from Jerusalem were saying: 'Beelzebul is in him' and, 'It is through the prince of devils that he casts devils out.' So Jesus called them to him and spoke to them in parables, 'How can Satan cast out Satan? If a kingdom is divided against itself, that kingdom can not last. And if a household is divided against itself, that household can never stand. Now if Satan has rebelled against himself and is divided, he can not stand either - it is the end of him. But no one can make his way into a strong man's house and burgle his property unless he has tied up the strong man first. Only then can he burgle his house.

'I tell you solemnly, all men's sins will be forgiven, and all their blasphemies: but let anyone blaspheme against the Holy Spirit and he will never have forgiveness: he is guilty of an eternal sin.' This was because they were saying, 'An unclean spirit is in him.'

The mother and brothers of Jesus arrived and, standing outside, sent in a message asking for him. A crowd was sitting round him at the time the message was passed to him, 'Your mother and brothers and sisters are outside asking for you.' He replied, 'Who are my mother and brothers?' And looking round at those sitting in a circle about him, he said, 'Here are my mother and my brothers. Anyone who does the will of God, that person is my brother and sister and mother.'
