

In today's Second reading, St Paul, is overflowing with gladness as he calls upon the Philippians to rejoice and give thanks to the Lord. In the Gospel, a multitude of people experience great joy as they approach John the Baptist asking for Baptism. Although John has many followers, he considers himself a mere servant who is unworthy to untie the straps of Jesus' sandals. What preparation does John propose to the crowd as they await the Messiah who will baptise them with the Holy Spirit and fire? He advises them to share their goods with the needy and to carry out their duties faithfully.

The publicans are taught to collect taxes justly and the soldiers are told to refrain from extortion and to be content with their salaries. If we heed the advice of John The Baptist, we can bring back joy and gladness to Christmas.

In today's Gaudete Sunday or Joyful Sunday, be glad and rejoice because we know that the Messiah is near

There were tax collectors too who came for baptism, and these said to him, 'Master, what must we do?' He said to them, 'Exact no more than your rate.' Some soldiers asked him in their turn, 'What about us? What must we do?' He said to them. 'No intimidation! No extortion! Be content with your

A feeling of expectancy had grown among the people, who were beginning to think that John might be the Christ, so John declared before them all, 'I baptise you with water, but someone is coming, someone who is more powerful than I am, and I am not fit to undo the strap of his sandals: he will baptise you with the Holy Spirit and fire. His winnowing-fan is in his hand to clear his threshing-floor and to gather the wheat into his barn; but the chaff he will burn in a fire that will never go out.' As well as this, there were many other things he said to exhort the people and to announce the Good News to them.
