For the last few weeks, the Sunday readings, especially the Gospels, continue to tell us that Jesus is the bread of life. This is simply to remind us of the importance of the Holy Eucharist in our Christian life.

Eucharist means "thanksgiving".

So filled with the Holy Spirit, we give thanks to God for inviting us to share in His wisdom, and in the Body and Blood of Christ.

In our First Reading today, God Himself, who is Wisdom, invites us to His banquet. However, only those who are humble accept his invitation. In their pride, the Jews in today's Gospel refused to be fools in order to be made wise in the ways of God. By this, they shut themselves out of the banquet of the Body and Blood of Christ. At times some of us behave like the Jews did. This is by assuming that we can analyse and understand the mystery of the Body & Blood of Christ with our limited human insight and the wisdom of this

#### St John's Parish/School Hall

The decision has been made to close the hall indefinitely. Issues with the floor and with compliance requirements mean that it's future needs to be carefully considered. A representative group from the Parish, the Bishop's Office, the Catholic Schools Office and St John's school is working on an interim plan to meet the requirements of the school and Parish in relation to the needs of our community concerning functions, meetings and larger community gatherings. Beyond the interim plan, a strategy for the future requirements of the school and Parish is being considered. We will keep the community informed as plans are progressed.
