

The blind Bartimaeus is the symbol of our journey to God. Like Bartimaeus, often we too, are blind.

We do not see the evil we commit; we do not perceive the need of others; at times we close our eyes to the injustices and oppressions that surround us; at other times we do not recognise Jesus who passes by us. The physical blindness arrests free movement of a person. The spiritual blindness

blocks our relationship with God and with another. Today, Jesus invites us to overcome our blindness following certain steps as suggested in the Gospel. First of all, we must recognise our inability to overcome our blindness on our own. Secondly, we must rely upon the power of God who only can change us and lead us to salvation.

Thirdly, we must overcome the obstacles on our way to encounter Jesus as Bartimaeus did.

Finally, we must give expression to our intense desire and hope in prayer and cry out with Bartimaeus.

'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned

and he followed him along the road.
