The healing of the deaf and dumb man occurs instantly and the confirmation of the healing is shown in the man's immediate ability to speak. Jesus orders the crowd not to divulge the news, but is disobeyed and his reputation keeps spreading. The comment of the crowd indicates that they are becoming aware that Jesus' messianic age has dawned. The healing of the deaf mute fulfils Isaiah's prophecy ( in the 1st Reading ) that lists as signs of the Lord's coming; the eyes of the blind opened, the ears of the deaf cleared, the lame leaping like stags, and the tongue of the dumb singing. More than 700 years before Christ, Isaiah declares that the Lord will pay more attention to persons with disabilities. The 2nd Reading from the letter of St James, also affirms that God takes care of the less fortunate. James also denounces those who discriminate against the poor.

We can use our faculties of hearing and speaking to hear selectively and speak unkind and demeaning words, or we can use our faculties to listen attentively to the world around us and to speak words that are kind and result in building up others.

The choice is ours!

**Fr Eric Burton (RIP)** Fr Eric Burton, Parish Priest Emeritus of Christ the King, North Rocks, died on Wednesday 5 September at Rosary Village, Yennora

Fr Eric Burton, ministered in the Parish of Dee Why from 1960-61. A faithful and good priest for 68 years. Father Eric was born on 24 October 1925 (and was just short of his 93rd birthday). He was ordained a priest with his brother Kevin on 22 July 1950 and was appointed founding Parish Priest of Christ the King, North Rocks on the 3 February 1970. He retired from that position on 5 March 2011. Fr Eric remained at North Rocks until 24 August 2015 when he moved into Rosary Village, Yennora. A reading from the holy Gospel according to Mark.


