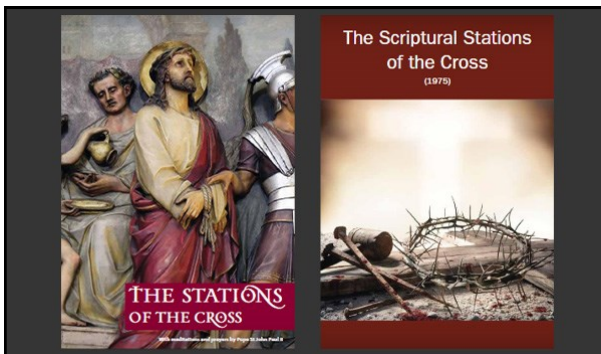
Holy Week begins with a parade. People get really involved throwing down their garments and rejoicing at all the mighty works they have witnessed through Jesus. Jesus rides triumphant through it all and encourages his followers to praise God with loud voice. In the long Gospel of the Passion we see Jesus no longer triumphant but separated from his followers, insulted, struck, spat upon, and finally carrying his cross to crucifixion on Golgotha: 'He emptied himself to assume the condition of a slave... even to accepting death on a cross. What reaction do I have to today's reading's? Has my Lenten journey prepared me to be really present during his Holy Week?

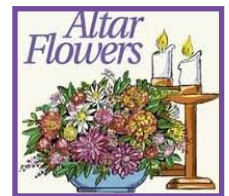
### Palm Sunday Reflection
