Baptism in Judaism in Jesus' time was done through immersion. One enters 'into the water' which recalls the death symbolism of the annihilating power of the ocean flood. One therefore 'dies' to sin which one confesses while being immersed in the water.

Jesus' Baptism is his 'anointing' by God, empowering him to preach the Gospel of the Kingdom. The Holy Spirit descends upon Jesus in bodily form like a dove. And the heavenly Father declares Jesus as his beloved Son, with whom he is well pleased. Receiving his 'credentials', Jesus begins his journey which will end in his death and resurrection.

Our own Baptism opens for us 'the door' to a journey from a state of sin into a new life, as we are 'immersed' in water and rise from it. St Paul tells us the effect of this sacrament: 'We went into the tomb with him and joined him in death, so that as Christ was raised from death by the Father's glory, we too might live a new life'.

"You will draw water joyfully from the springs of salvation".

to our God who is rich in forgiving;
for my thoughts are not your thoughts,
my ways not your ways - it is the Lord
who speaks.

earth as my ways are above your
ways, my thoughts above your
thoughts.

down from the heavens and do not

this is what loving God is -
keeping his commandments;
and his commandments are not diffi-

Only the man who believes that Jesus
is the Son of God:

Jesus Christ who came by water and

blood, not with water only,
but with water and blood;
with the Spirit as another witness -
since the Spirit is the truth -
so that there are three witnesses,
the Spirit, the water and the blood,
and all three of them agree.
We accept the testimony of human
witnesses, but God's testimony is
much greater, and this is God's testi-
mony, given as evidence for his Son.
