In the Gospel Jesus summons the twelve apostles and sends them out with a mandate to preach, to heal and to drive out evil spirits. They were mostly uneducated fisher folk. Like Amos, their authority to preach was not based on their qualifications but on the divine calling they received through Jesus. This calling made them ambassadors of God, acting on God's behalf. They had to face challenges and opposition. Yet their mission was amazingly successful because they trusted in the one who called and sent them. They remained faithful to their divine calling regardless of opposition.
