We do this by avoiding an overattachment to pleasure and fleeting happiness, such as the pleasures found in money, possessions, food and good times. It is when we come, little and poor, to Jesus, hungering for his merciful love, that we are blessed, both now and in the next life.

Alas for you who laugh now: you shall mourn and weep.

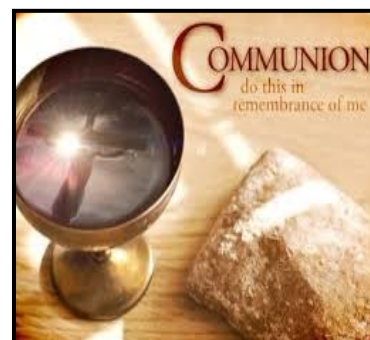
