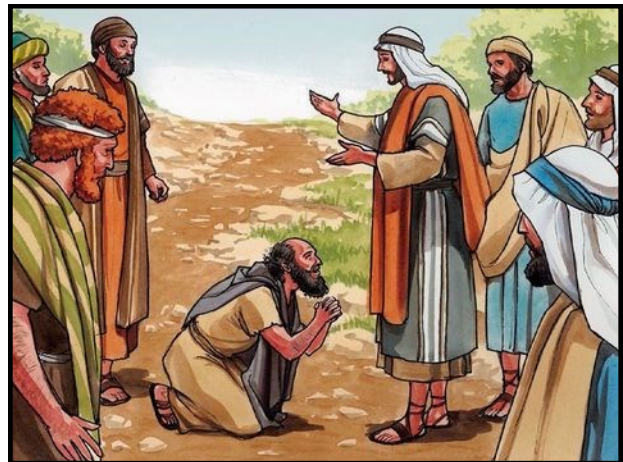

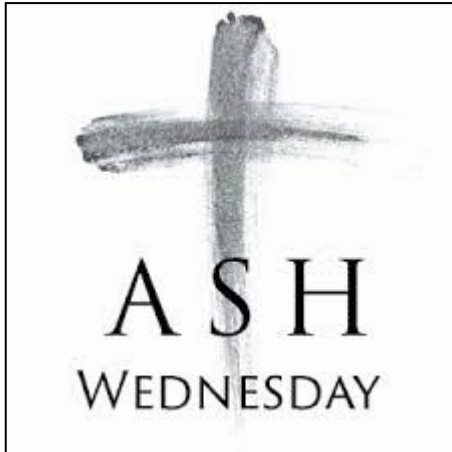

## **Instruction on Ash Wednesday in the midst of the Pandemic**

The Congregation for Divine Worship and the Discipline of the Sacraments has published a note on 12 January about how we are to Bless and Distribute

Ash at the commencement of Lent on Ash Wednesday on 17 February.

The note directs priests to say the formula for distributing the ashes once to everyone present, rather than to each person. The priest "addresses all those present and only once says the formula as it appears in the Roman Missal, applying it to all in general: 'Repent, and believe in the Gospel,' or 'Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shall return.'" It continues: "The priest then cleanses his hands, puts on a face mask and distributes the ashes to those who come to him or, if appropriate, he goes to those who are standing in their places. The Priest takes the ashes and sprinkles them on the head of each one without saying anything."

## **Digital Liturgy Resources**

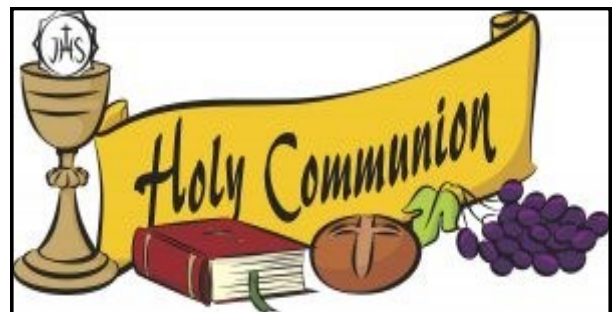

As long as the disease lasts he must be unclean; and therefore he must live apart; he must live outside the camp.'

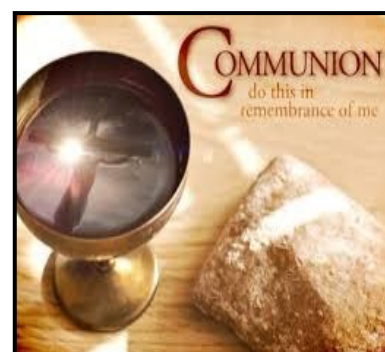
freely and telling the story everywhere, so that Jesus could no longer go openly into any town, but had to stay outside in places where nobody lived. Even so, people from all around would come to him.
