It was still dark when Mary Magdalene came to the tomb and found the stone moved away. Her first thought was not resurrection, but that someone had taken Jesus' body so she ran for help. When Peter arrived, he saw the burial cloths. When John arrived, he saw the same scene, but 'he believed'. John saw the eyes of his heart and just knew that God has raised Jesus from the dead.

Easter Sunday celebrates that darkness was overcome by light. But Easter is not a once-only event. We catch something of the reality of resurrection whenever we experience new life emerging from hopelessness.

It is all a matter of seeing reality through the eyes of our heart.

Easter Reflection


Faith in the resurrection of Christ is not automatic. Knowing the details of the first Easter Sunday like the empty tomb, the stone rolled away and the linen cloths is not enough. Yes these are necessary to establish the veracity of the resurrection, but they can be misinterpreted.

Mary Magdalene herself believed Jesus' body was taken away by someone. Peter was also quiet about what he saw and did not go further into the tomb

It was John, that made an act of faith. He saw and he believed. Many of the disciples failed to see the meaning of the resurrection because they had not understood the holy scriptures.

For us Christians today, we can appreciate our faith better if we have knowledge of sacred scriptures, both in the Old and the New Testament and understand the message contained therein.

Pray to God for an enlightened faith and that the Spirit of the Lord may guide you in your spiritual journey.

First Reading

Acts 10:34, 37-43

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

Peter addressed Cornelius and his household: You must have heard about the recent happenings in Judaea; about Jesus of Nazareth and how he began in Galilee, after John had been preaching baptism. God had anointed him with the Holy Spirit and with power, and because God was with him, Jesus went about doing good and curing all who had fallen into the power of the devil.' Now I, and those with me, can witness to everything he did throughout the countryside of Judaea and in Jerusalem itself: and also to the fact that they killed him by hanging him on a tree, yet three days afterwards God raised him to life and allowed him to be seen, not by the whole people but only by certain witnesses God had chosen beforehand. Now we are those witnesses - we have eaten and drunk with him after his resurrection from the dead - and he has ordered us to proclaim this to his people and to tell them that God has appointed him to judge everyone, alive or dead. It is to him that all the prophets bear this witness: that all who believe in Jesus will have their sins forgiven through his name.'

Gospel

John 20:1-9

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

It was very early on the first day of the week and still dark, when Mary of Magdala came to the tomb. She saw that the stone had been moved away from the tomb and came running to Simon Peter and the other disciple, the one Jesus loved. 'They have taken the Lord out of the tomb' she said 'and we don't know where they have put him.'

So Peter set out with the other disciple to go to the tomb. They ran together, but the other disciple, running faster than Peter, reached the tomb first; he bent down and saw the linen cloths lying on the ground, but did not go in. Simon Peter who was following now came up, went right into the tomb, saw the linen cloths on the ground, and also the cloth that had been over his head: this was not with the linen cloths but rolled up in a place by itself. Then the other disciple who had reached the tomb first also went in; he saw and he believed. Till this moment they had failed to understand the teaching of scripture, that he must rise from the dead.
