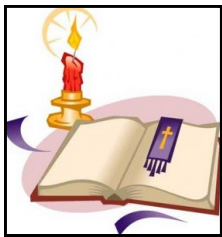
## Opening of St Kevin's Church

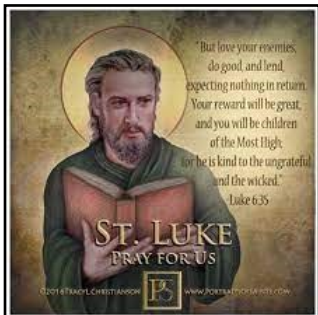


## Welcome to the 29th Sunday in Ordinary Time.

In the Gospels, we often hear stories that show a total disconnect between what Jesus is trying to show the disciples, and their understanding of it. Today's Gospel is one such instance. Jesus has just spoken of his upcoming death, and yet the disciples are

squabbling about who will take the places of honour in the Kingdom of Heaven. This passage encourages us to look squarely at the reality of the Kingdom of God that Jesus inaugurated, one where love and self-giving rule, rather than privilege and love of self.

**PRAYER:** Lord God, we pray for your mercy. Please forgive our shortcomings and failings, so that we may in turn show your mercy to others. Bless each of us with the patience and kindness to forgive those who fall short of our expectations. Give us eyes to see and ears to hear our family and friends as you see and hear them. We ask this in the name of Jesus Christ. Amen.



**FEAST:** Feast St Luke the Evangelist (October 18) St Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician" (Colossians 4:14). It is only in his Gospel that we hear of the Annunciation and the Archangel Gabriel's visit to Zechariah, the parable of the Good Samaritan, and stories

such as the one grateful Samaritan leper (Lk.17:11-19).

Tradition holds that St Luke received much of his information in his Gospel writings from Mary. Part

Jesus said to them, 'The cup that I must drink you shall drink, and with the baptism with which I must be baptised you shall be baptised, but as for seats at my right hand or my left, these are not mine to grant; they belong to those to whom they have been allotted.'

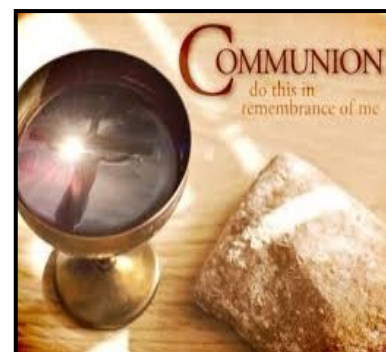
