In the Gospel reading from St Luke, Jesus appears among the disciples. Their joy is so overwhelming they are speechless. What happens next is most important. He sends them out to preach and teach 'all the nations'. They are to witness to Jesus and what he has done for humanity through his self-gift on the cross.

We today receive the same commission. As the descendants of the first disciples through faith in Jesus, we too are called to preach and teach. But how? As Christians our call from Christ is in four parts: to hear God's word in the sacraments of the Church and in God's creation, to receive God's word into our hearts, to live out God's word in our lives and to make real God's word in the world. The only way we can achieve any of this is through God's grace and love. Are we ready to be Christ's witnesses? Do we live out in our ordinary lives our great joy in the Christ of resurrection? How are we helping to make God's word real in this world?

But he said, 'Why are you so agitated, and why are these doubts rising in your hearts? Look at my hands and feet; yes, it is I indeed. Touch me and see for yourselves; a ghost has no flesh and

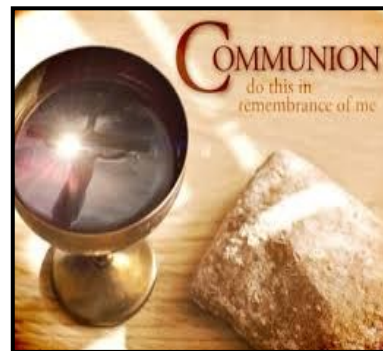
bones as you can see I have.' And as he said this he showed them his hands and feet. Their joy was so great that they could not believe it, and they stood dumbfounded; so he said to them, 'Have you anything here to eat?' And they offered him a piece of grilled fish, which he took and ate before their eyes.

Then he told them, 'This is what I meant when I said, while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the Law of Moses, in the Prophets and in the Psalms, has to be fulfilled.' He then opened their minds to understand the scriptures, and he said to them, 'So you see how it is written that the Christ would suffer and on the third day rise from the dead, and that, in his name, repentance for the forgiveness of sins would be preached to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses to this.'
