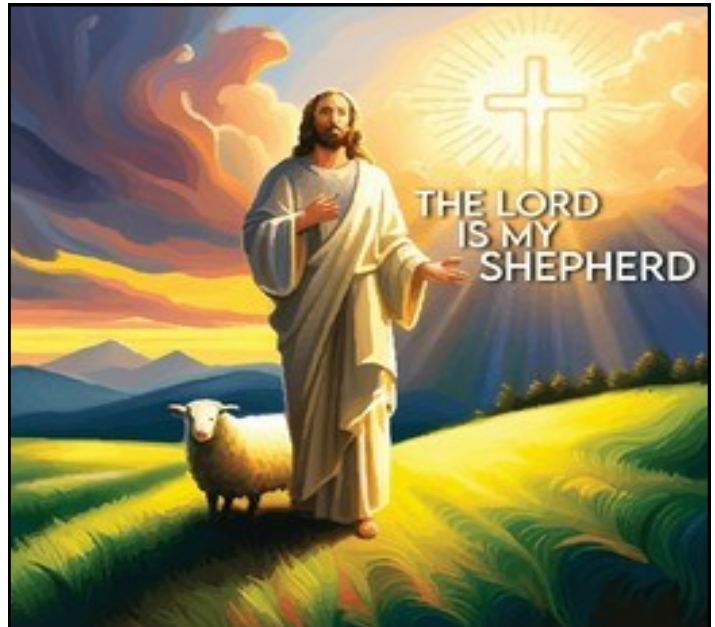

Jesus responds very differently to the two groups of people in today's Gospel. The first group— the apostles—have just returned from their mission and are very tired, so he says to them ' come away to a deserted place and rest for a while'. They still had much to learn but Jesus knows that their primary need at that time was to rest. The second group— the crowds—are lost and dejected. They are seeking something from Jesus so he sets about to teach them at length. A priest today can face a similar situation as he looks out at his congregation on a Sunday morning. Present are people who may be tired and simply need to rest in the Lord. Then there are others who are lost and dejected, who are hungry for God's word, who desire some input, some teaching . In some way the needs of both groups have to be honoured.

The Lord is my Shepherd; there is nothing I shall want.

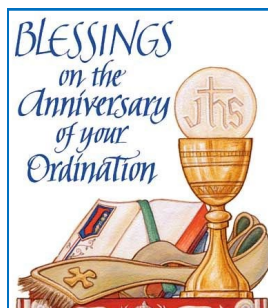

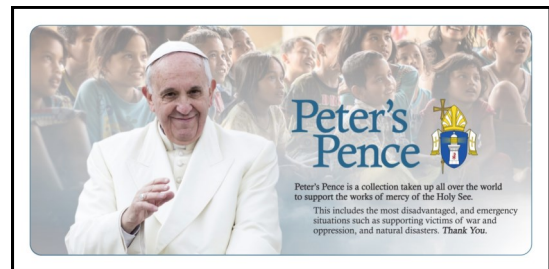

Sacrament of First Eucharist

The preparation for First Eucharist (Communion) begins with the enrolment meetings on 6 August (St Kevin's) or 8 August (St John's). Both meetings are at 7pm.

As you know, the program involves attending one of the enrolment meetings and all 4 lessons. At the enrolment meeting you will be given details on how to choose the time that you want to attend the lessons. You will also be able to choose the day you want your child to receive the sacrament. There will be only 35 places available at each of the masses for the children to receive First Eucharist. If you cannot attend the commitment meeting and all 4 lessons, there will be preparation for Eucharist at this time next year. 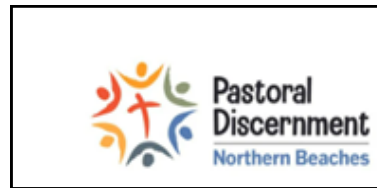


Feast SS. Salvatore (Our Holy Saviour), Narraweena

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

See, I have God for my help. The Lord sustains my soul. I will sacrifice to you with willing heart, and praise your name, O Lord, for it is good.

First Reading

Jeremiah 23:1-6

A reading from the prophet Jeremiah. 'Doom for the shepherds who allow the flock of my pasture to be destroyed and scattered - it is the Lord who speaks! This, therefore, is what the Lord, the God of Israel, says about the shepherds in charge of my people: You have let my flock be scattered and go wandering and have not taken care of them. Right, I will take care of you for your misdeeds - it is the Lord who speaks! But the remnant of my flock I myself will gather from all the countries where I have dispersed them, and will bring them back to their pastures: they shall be fruitful and increase in numbers. I will raise up shepherds to look after them and pasture them; no fear, no terror for them any more; not one shall be lost - it is the Lord who speaks! 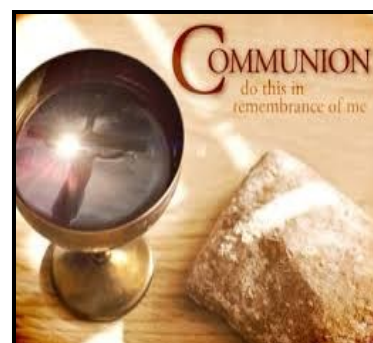
Gospel
