The last Sunday of the Church's Year, celebrates the universal kingship of Christ with encouraging and hope-filled readings! The psalm affirms our king's trustworthiness is forever. The second reading assures us that Jesus Christ loves us and calls us to service. Before reading the Gospel, pause a moment to imagine Jesus in the harrowing hours before he faced Pilate: being arrested, knowing he'd been betrayed by his companions; being struck, bound and dragged before the ruling authority because the Jewish leaders feared how he stood with and for the people. We are blessed to be 'subjects' of

the king who does not choose power for the sake of 'power over' and does not seek possessions of fame. Jesus desires only to empower the hearts of those he loves with truth ('I am the truth', John 14:6) while asking that we

bear witness to the truth and listen to his voice. In doing this, we live enabled by one king who is Love.

FEAST: Christ the King – 21st November Known officially as 'The Solemnity of Our Lord Jesus Christ, King of the Universe,' this feast was instituted by Pope Pius XI in 1925.

The Pope asserted that the most effective defence against the destructive forces of the age is the recognition of the kingship of Christ. At our baptism, each of us has been anointed as

priest, prophet, and king – so on this solemnity, we reflect on the kingship of Christ, and how we in our own lives are called to live as servant leaders, reflecting the Glory of God.

Pope Francis encourages Vatican journalists to always set out in search of the truth

Pope Francis' visit to Palazzo Pio- the building which houses Vatican Radio, the Holy See's Radio station; and L'Osservatore Romano, the daily newspaper of the Vatican City State, comes as Vatican Radio and L'Osservatore Romano mark their 90th and 160th anniversaries respectively, this year. This is Pope Francis' first-ever visit to the Radio.



Both Vatican Radio and L'Osservatore Romano are part of the Dicastery for Communication of the Holy See.

Pope Francis then proceeded to the Chapel where he spent a few moments in prayer...

"Lord, teach us to come out of ourselves, and to set out in search of the truth. Teach us to go and see, teach us to listen, not to cultivate prejudices, not to draw hasty conclusions...." the Pope prayed.

He even set aside some time to go "live-to-air" on "Radio Vaticana Italia" chatting briefly with some journalists about reaching out to as many listeners and readers as possible.

Pope Francis then proceeded to Palazzo Pio's "Sala Marconi" where he briefly addressed a group of Vatican journalists, urging them to work together more efficiently and to avoid functionalism.


