A common feature in today's Gospel reading is water and the weather conditions. We read that Jesus instructs the disciples to cross the lake and then falls asleep to be woken with panic and cries for help. The disciples understandably become frightened and frozen in fear by the gales and the waves. However, Jesus encourages an increase in patience and trust in his presence later rebuking the conditions and creating peace. This calmness is only realised once listening is undertaken, and trust is practised. When have you experience storms that seemed to overwhelm? How do you rediscover calm? Jesus teaches us today that to weather such storms, a deep trust in his presence is vital and life-saving.

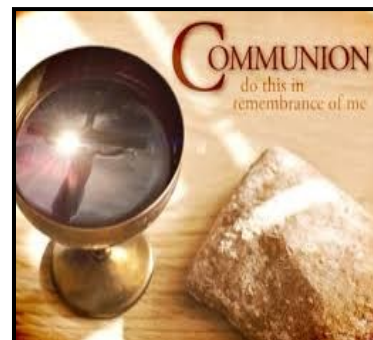
that you have no faith?' They were filled with awe and said to one another, 'Who can this be? Even the wind and the sea obey him.'
