This morning, on the day we celebrate the feast of Our lady of Fatima, 13 May, our Bishop Anthony Randazzo sent us a letter **MONDAY TO FRIDAY** explaining the new provisions according to the Government 8:30 AM announcement last Sunday, 10 May. 9:30 AM In his letter the Bishop outlined the following recommendations: 6:00 PM In respect to our own context, we can note the following which is possible from Friday 15 May 2020. Each of these provisions is SATURDAY contingent on practising social distancing of 4 square metres 8:30 AM per person and hand hygiene through the ready use of sanitiser. 9:30 AM • Churches are able to be open for private prayer, with a limit of 4:00 PM 10 people in the church at any one time. 5:00 PM • Religious gatherings, either formal or informal, are permissible 6:00 PM inside churches for groups not more than 10 people. The names of each person at the gathering must be recorded. **SUNDAY** • Weddings may be permitted for a group of 10 people. 8:00 AM Further clarification received from the NSW Premier's Office has been received advising that the couple and the celebrant 9:00 AM are not part of the group of 10 people. Entrance Antiphon

Men of Galilee, why gaze in wonder at the heavens? This Jesus whom you saw ascending into heaven will return as you saw him go, alleluia.

First Reading

Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles

In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations: for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem. but to wait there for what the Father had promised. 'It is' he had said 'what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit.'

Now having met together, they asked him, 'Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel?' He replied, 'It is not for you to know times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth.'

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, 'Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there.' The word of the Lord. **Thanks be to God.**
