### **Extract of letter from Bishop Anthony**

It is with a great sense of encouragement that New South Wales has achieved the target of 80% vaccination. This represents a remarkable response by the community to ensure the safety of everyone and to bring us out of the severe restrictions we have experienced since the end of June.

Places of Public Worship are exempt from the requirement of vaccination. Given that both vaccinated and unvaccinated may be present at Masses it will be important for us to convey to our people that they need to discern what may be in the best interests of their safety and that of their families. I recognize that for a number of our people now will not be the time to return to the public celebration of Masses in our churches. Therefore, I continue to suspend the Sunday Obligation until 1 December in order to assure our people of our respect for the personal choices they may need to make during this initial period of emergence from lockdown.

In resuming Masses, it will be important for us to follow all those COVID safety requirements around density of gatherings, QR registration, the wearing of masks and refraining from congregational singing. The government regulations do allow for a small choir of up to 10 people, and therefore I encourage you to call upon musicians and singers in that capacity. We continue to celebrate Mass in the way that we have since the commencement of the pandemic, mindful of the many ways by which we ensure everyone's safety. I wish you every blessing as you reach out and regather your parish communities in person, and I pray that this time will be one of great grace for you and for our people as the public

one of great grace for you and for our people as the public celebration of the Eucharist and the Sacraments is possible once again.

Welcome to the 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time As our Sunday Gospel readings move through the Gospel of Mark each week, Jesus and his disciples move closer to their destination, Jerusalem. In today's reading, they're not too far off, in Jericho. There they are interrupted by Bartimaeus, a blind man, yelling for Jesus' attention. Jesus stops, and calls for him. The crowd has a role here, to bring him to Jesus. After previously trying to silence him, they now encourage him. Once his physical sight has been restored, we see that Bartimaeus has gained much more – a renewed spiritual sight as shown by his following of Jesus at the end of the passage. In our own lives, are we persistent in searching out Jesus? Do we actively encourage others to come to Jesus?

PRAYER: Lord Jesus, you have delivered us through difficult and troubled times in our past. You have done great things for us; we are filled with joy. Help us to see your saving power in our world today. May we be restored in our faith just as Bartimaeus was in You. Amen

And many of them scolded him and told him to keep quiet, but he only shouted all the louder, 'Son of David, have pity on me.' Jesus stopped and said, 'Call him here.' So they called the blind man. 'Courage,' they said 'get up; he is calling you.' So throwing off his cloak, he jumped up and went to Jesus. Then Jesus spoke, 'What do you want me to do for you?' 'Rabbuni,' the blind man said to him 'Master, let me see again.' Jesus said to him, 'Go; your faith has saved you.' And immediately his sight returned and he followed him along the road.
