
The Gospel for the first Sunday in Lent recounts Jesus alone in a stark desert landscape. The three temptations that Jesus received, while different in context, all relate to compromising his mission. Satan the tempter, proposes seemingly good alternative choices to Jesus. The desert encounter testifies to the humanity of Jesus. It is an inevitable part of being human to struggle with the spirits of both light and darkness.

We enter these six weeks of Lent within the backdrop of this desert scene. It is in this context that we experience a heightened sensitivity in discerning the subtle ways in which spirits of light and darkness compete for the holy ground of our hearts.

We ask that we may have the clarity and strength of Jesus to remain faithful to choosing all that is anchored in and springs forth from the source of the true light.

'Be with me, Lord, when I am in trouble'.



Vox Populi

6 March 2025

The Season of Lent has begun.

The beginning of this season was marked by Ash Wednesday and the reception of ashes, a sign of mortality and repentance.

Throughout the next few weeks, we will engage in fasting, abstinence, almsgiving and prayer. While at many times, we can become obsessed with the individual penances we have chosen, ultimately the season is about drawing closer to Christ and to one another as members of His Body, the Church.

Our outward actions should reflect an inner joy and a conversion towards Christ. When we fast or abstain, we are reminded it is not worldly or physical things that give us joy, but rather, it is the love of Christ.

On Ash Wednesday and Good Friday, 18 April 2025, the Church calls us to abstain from meat and to fast as acts of penance and self-denial. All those who have completed their fourteenth year of age are to abstain from meat on these days, and those between the ages of 18 and 60 are urged to fast. Bishop Anthony Randazzo has urged all the faithful to embrace these Lenten disciplines not as a burden or imposition, but as joyful opportunities to grow closer to the Lord and to one another, as we share in the love and mercy of God.

The faithful are also encouraged to participate in the Sacrament of Reconciliation throughout this Lenten season, receiving additional graces to prepare us for the Easter season.





SCRIPTURE READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

When he calls on me, I will answer him; I will deliver him and give him glory, I will grant him length of days.

First Reading

Deuteronomy 26:4-10 A reading from the book of Deuteronomy.

Moses said to the people: 'The priest shall take the pannier from your hand and lay it before the altar of the Lord your God. Then, in the sight of the Lord your God, you must make this pronouncement:

"My father was a wandering Aramaean. He went down into Egypt to find refuge there, few in numbers; but there he became a nation, great, mighty, and strong. The Egyptians ill-treated us, they gave us no peace and inflicted harsh slavery on us. But we called on the Lord, the God of our fathers. The Lord heard our voice and saw our misery, our toil and our oppression; and the Lord brought us out of Egypt with mighty hand and outstretched arm, with great terror, and with signs and wonders. He brought us here and gave us this land, a land where milk and honey flow. Here then I bring the first-fruits of the produce of the soil that you, Lord, have given me." You must then lay them before the Lord your God, and bow down in the sight of the Lord your God.'

By believing from the heart you are made righteous; by confessing with your lips you are saved. When scripture says: those who believe in him will have no cause for shame, it makes no distinction between Jew and Greek: all belong to the same Lord who is rich enough, however many ask for his help, for everyone who calls on the name of the Lord will be saved.

Gospel

Luke 4:1-13

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke.

Filled with the Holy Spirit, Jesus left the Jordan and was led by the Spirit through the wilderness, being tempted there by the devil for forty days. During that time he ate nothing and at the end he was hungry. Then the devil said to him, 'If you are the Son of God, tell this stone to turn into a loaf.' But Jesus replied, 'Scripture says: Man does not live on bread alone.'

Then leading him to a height, the devil showed him in a moment of time all the kingdoms of the world and said to him, 'I will give you all this power and the glory of these kingdoms, for it has been committed to me and I give it to anvone I choose. Worship me, then, and it shall all be yours.' But Jesus answered him, 'Scripture says: You must worship the Lord your God,

and serve him alone.'

Then he led him to Jerusalem and made him stand on the parapet of the Temple. 'If you are the Son of God,' he said to him, 'throw yourself down from here, for Scripture says:

He will put his angels in charge of you to guard you, and again:

They will hold you up on their hands in case you hurt your foot against a stone.'

But Jesus answered him, 'It has been said: You must not put the Lord your God to the test.'
