Jesus tells the disciples of John the Baptist, to report to him in prison, that the One whom he baptised in the River Jordan, (with the Holy Spirit descending on him in the form of a dove), is truly the Messiah. They do not have to look for another. The proofs can be seen in the blind regaining their sight, the lame walking, and the sick being healed. These are the signs of the presence of the Messiah and the coming of God's Kingdom. These miracles and the proclamation of the Kingdom should be sufficient to comfort John in his cell. His efforts to prepare for the coming of the Messiah have not been in vain.

In the Gospel, Jesus is working round the clock. He fulfils the Prophecy of Isaiah, bringing healing to the lame, the blind, the lepers, and many other sick people.

The Second Reading teaches the Christians to be patient over the delay of the Lord's second coming. Christians should not become irritable.

If we cannot wait patiently, we will be sorry forever. There will be no joy in our hearts. Even if the Lord comes, his coming will have no meaning for us.


CHURCH CLEANING

SCRIPTURE READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

Rejoice in the Lord always; again I say, rejoice. Indeed, the Lord is near.

First Reading

Isaiah 35:1-6, 10

A reading from the prophet Isaiah Let the wilderness and the dry-lands exult, let the wasteland rejoice and bloom, let it bring forth flowers like the jonquil, let it rejoice and sing for joy.

The glory of Lebanon is bestowed on it, the splendour of Carmel and Sharon; they shall see the glory of the Lord, the splendour of our God.

Strengthen all weary hands, steady all trembling knees and say to all faint hearts, 'Courage! Do not be afraid. 'Look your God is coming, vengeance is coming, the retribution of God; he is coming to save you.'

Then the eyes of the blind shall be opened, the ears of the deaf unsealed, then the lame shall leap like a deer and the tongues of the dumb sing for joy, for those the Lord has ransomed shall return.

They will come to Zion shouting for joy, everlasting joy on their faces; joy and gladness will go with them and sorrow and lament be ended.

Responsorial Psalm Ps 145:6-10

R. Lord, come and save us.

It is the Lord who keeps faith for ever, who is just to those who are oppressed. It is he who gives bread to the hungry, the Lord, who sets prisoners free. R.

It is the Lord who gives sight to the blind, who raises up those who are bowed down, the Lord, who protects the stranger and upholds the widow and orphan. **R**.

It is the Lord who loves the just

but thwarts the path of the wicked. The Lord will reign for ever, Zion's God, from age to age R.

Second Reading James 5:7-10

A reading from the letter of St James Be patient, brothers, until the Lord's coming. Think of a farmer: how patiently he waits for the precious fruit of the ground until it has had the autumn rains and the spring rains! You too have to be patient; do not lose heart, because the Lord's coming will be soon. Do not make complaints against one another, brothers, so as not to be brought to judgement yourselves; the Judge is already to be seen waiting at the gates. For your example, brothers, in submitting with patience, take the prophets who spoke in the name of the Lord.

and see; the blind see again, and the
lame walk, lepers are cleansed, and
the deaf hear, and the dead are raised
to life and the Good News is
proclaimed to the poor; and happy is
the man who does not lose faith in
me.'


