

Today's Gospel is theologically rich in its links to people and events of the Old Testament. Jesus' divine Sonship is revealed with reference to Moses and the Exodus, to Elijah as precursor to the messiah, and to King David as the Lord's 'chosen'. Certain details catch our attention. For instance, three disciples witness a manifestation of God's glory, staying awake despite being 'heavy with sleep'. Really? Can you imagine sleeping through such an event?!

Perhaps 'sleep' suggests something else: grief, fear, doubt? Moses and Elijah are speaking to Jesus about his 'passing' (his impending death). Peter's misstep is understandable : what can one 'say' amidst an experience both wondrous and terrifying? In the end, the dramatic declaration of Jesus as 'the Chosen One' renders the disciples silent. Perhaps, like Mary, they were learning to 'ponder these things' in their hearts. What is brewing in my own heart as I ponder this intriguing story?



SCRIPTURE READINGS

Entrance Antiphon

Of you my heart has spoken: Seek his face. It is your face, O Lord, that I seek: hide not your face from me.

First Reading: Genesis 15:5-12, 17-18

A reading from the book of Genesis Taking Abram outside the Lord said, 'Look up to heaven and count the stars if you can. Such will be your descendants' he told him. Abram put his faith in the Lord, who counted this as making him justified.

'I am the Lord' he said to him 'who brought you out of Ur of the Chaldaeans to make you heir to this land.' 'My Lord, the Lord' Abram replied 'how am I to know that I shall inherit it?' He said to him, 'Get me a three-year-old heifer, a three-year-old goat, a three-year-old ram, a turtledove and a young pigeon.' He brought him all these, cut them in half and put half on one side and half facing it on the other; but the birds he did not cut in half. Birds of prey came down on the carcasses but Abram drove them off.

Now as the sun was setting Abram fell into a deep sleep, and terror seized him. When the sun had set and darkness had fallen, there appeared a smoking furnace and a firebrand that went between the halves. That day the Lord made a Covenant with Abram in these terms: 'To your descendants I give this land.

from the wadi of Egypt to the Great River.'

Gospel: Luke 9:28-36

A reading from the holy Gospel according to Luke

Jesus took with him Peter and John and James and went up the mountain to pray. As he prayed, the aspect of his face was changed and his clothing became brilliant as lightning. Suddenly there were two men there talking to him; they were Moses and Elijah appearing in glory, and they were speaking of his passing which he was to accomplish in Jerusalem. Peter and his companions were heavy with sleep, but they kept awake and saw his glory and the two men standing with him. As these were leaving him, Peter said to Jesus, 'Master, it is wonderful for us to be here; so let us make three tents, one for you, one for Moses and one for Elijah.' - He did not know what he was saying. As he spoke, a cloud came and covered them with shadow: and when they went into the cloud the disciples were afraid. And a voice came from the cloud saying, 'This is my Son, the Chosen One. Listen to him'. And after the voice had spoken, Jesus was found alone. The disciples kept silence and, at that time, told no one what they had seen.
